Nursing Career Day "What's it like to be a nurse?"

First aid training for primary school students teaching basic skills for handling emergencies safely. It covers recognizing when someone needs help, calling for emergency services, and caring for minor injuries like cuts or bleeding.

Students also learn the importance of personal safety, including proper hand washing to prevent infections. The steps are: wet hands, apply soap, scrub all parts (palms, backs, between fingers, nails, and thumbs) for 20 seconds, rinse thoroughly, and dry.

Training also includes practicing the recovery position and introducing CPR, all in a fun and interactive way to build confidence. Besides that, we took the opportunity to remember the contribution of the nurses too.

OUR NATURE WALKS










