#### Why Christ call us to worship

Easter serivces are usually well attended, but what about other weeks? What draws you to worship on an "average" Sunday, and what might Jesus have in store for people in the pews?

Did we think we could get a little something from Jesus, a dose of grace to help us through the week? Did we come for the fellowship, the music, the spiritual boost? No one can argue with those reasons."

He continues: "The risen Christ, however, may have had other plans for this worship service. Christ may want to come under our skins and transform us. Christ may see through us so that something we have well hidden comes to the surface. Christ may kick out from under us the things we use to prop ourselves up but that we don't really need. Are we ready for that? Did we bargain on that when we walked through the door today?"

Liturgy specialist Chan Gyu Jang writes, "On an Advent-oriented Palm Sunday, we know not only that we face fierce opposition and ridicule in this world, but that salvation comes in the least expected, most unforeseen way: a baby born of a virgin and laid in a manger, a man from Nazareth riding on a donkey, a 'King of Jews' crucified between thieves, and empty tomb, wind and fire, bread and wine, a trumpet call out of nowhere, yet heard in every ear."

## Pastoral Search Update

Your LdF session met Thursday, April 7, with the Pastoral Nominating Committee (PNC)along with Pastor Lawrence Lee of the Presbyterian Committee on Ministry. Pastor Lee reiterated that securing an interim minister is next to impossible, so we are thankful we can look to Jack Fashbaugh and other supply pastors to continue to give us the spiritual guidance we seek. It appears calling a pastor to our church is going to take time, much hard work and decision making by the congregation. Know you have a dedicated session and PNC that is ready to listen to you and the job will get done with our patience.

In the next few weeks, a Mission Study will be revisited and now would be the time to voice your ideas, thoughts, questions, input, your hopes and the vision you have for the future of our church.

The committee to secure a pastor is working on a DRAFT yoking agreement that will be shared with the congregation. Because of our small congregation, our limited budget and our special pastoral needs, we are exploring the idea of yoking with Manitowish Waters Community Church. This DRAFT will serve as a means of documenting how we might work together, what is shared and what is kept separate, how our finances would be structured to pay for the pastor and the housing of the pastor, via our manse. This DRAFT yoking agreement will be a guideline for a conversation with Manitowish Waters in May.

As well as a yoking document, we will also be drafting documents (Ministry Information Forms - MIFs) that will be used to call a minister, whether it is a yoked situation, or not. We are trying to proactively cover as many possibilities as we can in order to secure a minister. Hopefully by early summer, both churches will have a meeting to vote on which direction we want to take.

**Your help and input are needed.** Please know that the session and PNC are ready to listen to you and feel free to speak with any one of us. As a reminder, your session members are Tom Gelwicks, Owen Karlman, Ralph Kerler, Kathy LaBarge, Glenn Morrison, Bill Raduege, Steve Schunk and Jillian Consie. Your Pastoral Nominating Committee is the session plus Carol Gelwicks and Shirlee Gallagher.

## Also of note:

- Manitowish Waters church session is having its regular monthly meeting April 18 and our session member Ralph Kerler will attend as liaison.
- On May 1, Manitowish Waters church will have a congregation meeting to install their PNC. Jack Fashbaugh will moderate that meeting and our session will have a liaison present.
- We will keep you posted as we progress on the DRAFT yoking agreement that is to be used simply as a document to capture what a possible agreement may look like and provide a basis for further conversations between our sessions/PNCs, etc.

- The LdF CPC session will meet Tuesday, May 10, at 10 am. *If anyone from the congregation would like to attend and ask questions and provide input, you are welcome.*
- We would like to plan a Joint PNC meeting with Manitowish Waters' session and/or PNC in May. We are interested in hosting the meeting and providing a supper.
- We encourage members of our congregation to visit the Manitowish Waters church website, attend services, watch their services via the internet, etc.
