TO: All the Good and Faithful folk of the Community Presbyterian Church:

It has been a long and difficult year for everyone, including churches, who have been hit very hard by the Covid 19 pandemic. You may recall that one year ago, on March 22, church was cancelled due to a very severe snow-storm and we have not had traditional services since that time. We have learned much about the Zoom services, had a wonderful special service in the parking lot last fall and have demonstrated our resilience with the aid of many more skilled than are we. It has been challenging, at times enjoyable, but always - - just not the same. Some, ranging from 8-13 or so attend regularly and assist in the program. Overtime, however, I sense a desire for us to be together - - the on-line service is in many ways a lot of fun, but many wish to move on. Over the past 5 weeks or so, we have been meeting after church briefly for refreshment and it is almost not possible to describe the feeling. We really need the "politicos" of all stripes to ring-in their personal power ventures, and do their job of working for and with each other. The gospel teaches us to "love" one another - - not try to destroy one another. In addition, even though our income was lower due to losing the usual contributions from the Attic, we are still able to meet our primary commitments. Our Christian faith is a life-long journey, a struggle to understand and grow. Whenever I struggle, I try to remember several texts which speak directly to me. You know them well, "God so loved the world...; God was in Christ, reconciling the world...; and God emptied Godself, so that God could be grasped by the human mind." God is always available, if we openly seek His love and challenges.

Let me also say at this time, if you are local and would like to attend church in person, we will welcome your return. We wish to approach this cautiously for the safety of all.

In the meantime, stay well, do good work, and may the Lord be with you always!
