## A Love Letter To The Saints of Community Presbyterian Church

*In the days to come the mountain of the LORD's house shall be established as the highest of the mountains and shall be raised above the hill; all the nations shall stream to it...*

*"Come, let us go up to the mountain of the LORD, to the house of the God of Jacob; that he may teach us his ways and that we may walk in his paths."...He shall judge between the nations, and shall arbitrate for many peoples; they shall beat their swords into plowshares, and their spears into pruning hooks...*

*O house of Jacob, come, let us walk in the light of the LORD!*

Isaiah 2.1-5 (selected verses)

To the Saints of Community Presbyterian Church engaged in God's mission, greetings:

We began the season of Advent with these words from the prophet Isaiah. We hear them again at the beginning of this new calendar year, words of hope and peace that conclude with this invitation: "*O house of Jacob, come, let us walk in the light of the LORD!*" It's a new year, a time of resolutions and re-commitments. While it is easy to scoff at "new year's resolutions", they represent hope for us amidst the days that await our living and loving. The prophet Isaiah imagines a powerful hope of God for peace as people gather together to learn from God how weapons designed to destroy can be transformed into instruments of growth. Talk about a transformative resolution!

Realizing our resolutions requires that we begin, and then pace ourselves in order for the new practice to become a habit. While we desire instant results, life tends to reflect steady efforts. Most of us have experienced the amazing transformation of an infant who goes from rolling over to crawling to picking themselves up to staggering as they begin to walk. Once they've learned to balance, their steps become more assured, the distances covered expand, and eventually they begin running. Running begins with walking. An offer to renew our discipleship in this new year is found in accepting the invitation, "come...let us walk in the light of the LORD". January 6<sup>th</sup> is the celebration of Epiphany, a word that means revelation, especially with respect to light. May the "light of the LORD" faithfully illuminate your life as you walk in the light of the LORD during 2023!

Thank you for your witness to God's mission in the person of Jesus through the passion and purpose of the Holy Spirit and for your witness to God's Way in the world as you love God and neighbor and yourself, and for your presence in the Community Presbyterian Church.


## Epiphany

"Epiphany" means manifestation or revelation. Just as the magi come from a distant land to worship the child Jesus, God's covenant of grace is extended to all people who believe the good news of God in Jesus. The symbolism of light is important—not only because of the star guiding the visitors—but because light symbolizes the bright dawning of God's self-revelation in Jesus. As Christians, we are called to bear Christ's light in the world.

The Sundays after epiphany contain certain notable features of this period of time in the Christian calendar. The Sundays are bracketed by the Baptism of the Lord Sunday and Transfiguration Sunday, days in which the Gospel texts remind us of how God affirms Jesus as a beloved Son. The lectionary readings of the season highlight the themes of Christian vocation, discipleship, and community. The Sundays after Epiphany are a flexible period of time, from four to nine Sundays, depending upon the variable date of Easter.
