# A Love Letter To The Saints of Community Presbyterian Church

That same day Jesus went out of the house and sat beside the sea. Such great crowds gathered around him that he got into a boat and sat there, while the whole crowd stood on the beach. And he told them many things in parables, saying: "Listen! A sower went out to sow. And as he sowed, some seeds fell on the path, and the birds came and ate them up. Other seeds fell on rocky ground, where they did not have much soil, and they sprang up quickly, since they had no depth of soil. But when the sun rose, they were scorched; and since they had no root, they withered away. Other seeds fell among thorns, and the thorns grew up and choked them. Other seeds fell on good soil and brought forth grain, some a hundredfold, some sixty, some thirty. Let anyone with ears listen!"

Matthew 13.1-9

To the Saints of Community Presbyterian Church engaged in God's mission, greetings;

The Gospel of Matthew contains five teaching sections, and this text introduces the third, teaching in parables. This familiar parable has been called by a number of titles through the years, "The Parable of the Sower" being the most common. Jesus has perhaps, in gazing, noticed a farmer sowing as he tells the story. In Palestine, the seed was scattered on the ground and then the ground was turned over, not the other way around as it is in agriculture in the west. The path would have been packed by animals walking single file, the rocky ground was the most common ground in Palestine; after the seeds were turned into the ground, some found a plethora of other seeds to compete with, others found more suitable soil. And there is a harvest—not only a harvest but a bountiful harvest!

There is an interpretation of the parable found in Matthew 13.18-23, wherein the seed becomes the "word of the kingdom" and is perhaps Matthew's construction. Here, in the short, short story, what's remarkable is that the sower sows seed, trusting that the seed will take root and lead to a harvest, an abundant harvest, without getting caught up/tied down with outcomes. The sower simply trusts. So does Jesus trust that in telling us the story, we too will persevere in trust, and bear fruit.

Thank you for your witness to God's mission in the person of Jesus through the passion and purpose of the Holy Spirit and for your witness to God's Way in the world as you love God and neighbor and yourself, and for your presence in the Community Presbyterian Church.

### Inside The Attic: Process And People

Recently a number of the persons who volunteer at The Attic were asked what they enjoyed about their experience of being a part of The Attic crew. Their responses can be loosely categorized around resources: process and people.

All of the goods The Attic has for resale are donated and they represent a wide variety from jewelry to clothing to household goods. Upon receipt, the goods are sorted and priced and prepared for sale. This process is one of many opportunities for volunteers who contribute their time and energy to The Attic. This represents the first half of the treasure hunt that The Attic offers: the discovery of what has been donated, goods that are items not otherwise available in other places at reasonable prices. The second half of the treasure hunt occurs when patrons stop by to discover something they have—or even have not—been looking for. These two aspects of the treasure hunt thus bring joy to the helpers and the seekers.

Amongst the people—both the volunteers and the customers—there is a range of personalities and peculiarities, the differences adding to the pleasure of the experience! There is a camaraderie among the volunteers that helps heighten the experience and there is a commonality amongst the shoppers who come looking for treasures, resulting in much joy being shared between individuals, as both clients and volunteers provide inspiration.

Ultimately, the process and the people provide a valuable and missional service with The Attic, as all of the donated goods are priced to sell, and the proceeds go to benefiting persons and causes within the Northwoods. In 2022, \$15,000.00 was earned from sales and distributed to recipients.

## The Parking Lot

The discovery of a sink hole in the parking lot has led to the Lac du Flambeau Band of Lake Superior Chippewa Indians desiring to do a ground-penetrating radar examination of the parking lot to the east of the church building to clarify if there are any human remains that were not exhumed previously. The process will not disturb the pavement and seeks to answer lingering questions as to whether or not all of the graves were removed before the parking lot was expanded.
