AMIDST THE SEASON OF EASTER: ASCENSION OF THE LORD

Forty days after celebrating the Resurrection of the Lord, near the conclusion of the season of Easter, we commemorate the ascension of the Lord Jesus Christ into heaven. On this day in particular, we give thanks for Christ's sovereign rule over all creation. WE proclaim with joy that Jesus is already Lord of heaven and earth and head of the church.

The theological affirmation of Christ's ascension to reign and promised return is more important than the date on which the festival is observed. The dating of forty days after Jesus' resurrection follows the chronology in Acts.

Ascension of the Lord is always celebrated on a Thursday. This year the date is May 18th. The liturgical color for Ascension is white, continuing the color for the Easter season.

THE CONCLUSION OF THE SEASON OF EASTER: PENTECOST

"Pentecost" comes from a Greek word meaning fiftieth day. On this day, the Holy Spirit came with wind and flame, equipping the disciples to proclaim the good news of the risen Lord to all people. Falling on the fiftieth day of the season of Easter, Pentecost represents the culmination of the church's seven-week celebration of Christ's resurrection. As the Lord's Day is sometimes called the "eighth day" of creation, Pentecost is a day of new creation—all things transformed and made new by the Word and Breath of the living God. On the Day of Pentecost we give particular thanks for the gift of God's Holy Spirit, who gathers the church as the body of Christ and sends us to share in Christ's mission throughout the world.

The notion of Easter as a season of fifty days is patterned after the ancient Jewish period of seven weeks that extended from the beginning of the barley harvest, after Passover, to the end of the wheat harvest at the Festival of Weeks (in Hebrew, Shavuot). In Jewish tradition, Shavuot also marks the giving of the law to Moses at Sinai, a connection that may inform Paul's discussion of the law and the Spirit.

This year, the fiftieth day in the Season of Easter falls on May 28th. The liturgical color for Pentecost is red.

A Love Letter To The Saints of Community Presbyterian Church

Mary Magdalene went and announced to the disciples, "I have seen the Lord"... When it was evening on that day, the first day of the week, and the doors of the house were locked for fear of the Jews, Jesus came and stood among them and said, "Peace be with you." After he said this, he showed them his hands and his side. Then the disciples rejoiced when they saw the Lord. Jesus said to them again, "Peace be with you. As the Father has sent me, so I send you." When he had said this, he breathed on them and said to them, "Receive the Holy Spirit."

John 20.18a, 19-22

To the Saints of Community Presbyterian Church engaged in God's mission, greetings;

First of all, no the above is not a mis-print, nor is it a proof-reading error. It is in fact the same text I reflected on for the April newsletter. It is fitting to reflect out of it again this Easter season. Mary Magdalene is the only witness to the events of the first Easter morning in each of the Gospels. This a reminder that if the resurrection narratives were composed to be a "proof" of the event, they never would have been constructed with a woman as the witness. Thus this is a story of faith, for those who have eyes to see and ears to hear.

Mary Magdalene goes to the disciples and announces that she has "seen the Lord". Later that first Easter evening, Jesus appears to the disciples, offers them Peace (twice) and then fills them with the Holy Spirit through his breath. Easter is the fifty-day season when the Church celebrates not only Jesus' resurrection, but the opportunity to—with our own eyes—experience the risen Lord ourselves. How have you experienced the Lord's peace? Where do you believe the culture in which we live needs to experience the risen Lord, the one who offers both peace and the presence and presents of the Holy Spirit? How have you experienced the voice of the Spirit given by Jesus to his disciples? These questions are important for us to embrace, because, given Jesus' departure to be with God, we—you and I and everyone who identifies as a disciple of Jesus—are his witnesses in the wake of his resurrection.

Thank you for your witness to God's mission in the person of Jesus through the passion and purpose of the Holy Spirit and for your witness to God's Way in the world as you love God and neighbor and yourself, and for your presence in the Community Presbyterian Church.
