

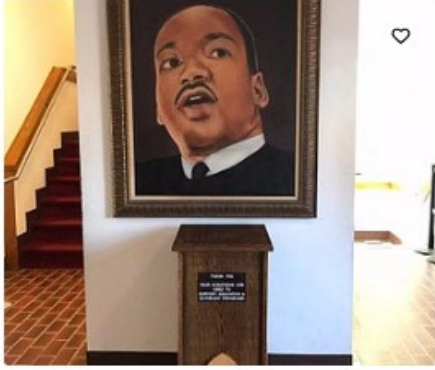

Our tour is conducted by local tour guide and historian Ms. Stephanie, who has lived and worked in Atlanta for thirty plus years and worked for three Mayors of Atlanta. Travelers are paying (starting at \$36.99) for a guided tour. Self-guided tours are free. You are provided an overview of the life of Dr. Martin Luther King Jr. from his formative years as a youth growing up on Auburn Ave, once called the richest Negro street in the world, to Dr. King's impact as a leader in the Civil Rights Movement. We are conducting a walking tour of the area and its legendary history. The tour begins at the Visitor Center. Take a short walk to Auburn Ave and hear of its illustrious history and fame. Continue on Auburn to the neighborhood of King's boyhood home. Also on Auburn is the beautiful Reflecting Pool and the tombs of Dr. and Mrs. King, Jr. End at Ebenezer Baptist Church where Dr. King, Jr, senior and grandfather pastored.

Children's Museum of Atlanta, a nonprofit 501(c)(3), is the only educational venue of its kind in Atlanta. Through community outreach initiatives, educational programs, and exhibits designed for children ages 0–8, the Museum strives to spark every child's imagination, sense of discovery and learning through the power of play. Tickets must be purchased online. Admission for non-members is \$13.95 per adult or child. Important Health and Safety Guidelines:

- We are currently limiting capacity, introducing timed entry slots, and requiring all tickets to be purchased online in advance. This will allow for a contact-free admission process.
- Everyone is required to wear a face covering during their visit (ages 3 and up).
- Temperature scans required.
- Wash your hands with soap and water often for at least 20 seconds.
- When present, please stand on the floor markings until the group in front of you moves forward.
- Practice social distancing and keep at least 6 feet (2 meters) between your travel party and others.

- Pay by card in store. No cash payments.
