Storm Season Prep

With storm season approaching, now is the time to inspect trees for large, dead limbs that could become hazardous in high winds.

Removing these limbs early can prevent property damage and keep your trees healthier.

Trees with overly thick canopies can also be a risk during storms—thinning the canopy allows for better airflow, reducing wind resistance and helping your trees stay upright during severe weather.



Fertilize & Aerate
