

A BRIEF LOOK AT SOME SUMMER HILL HISTORY

After the old church burned in 1958, many events and fundraisers were held to benefit the building of the new St. Paul's Lutheran Church. Following is one of the fundraisers which was held in July 1962.

A two-hour band concert will be presented by the Cressona Band, with J. Richard Zimmerman, director and Harry Yeich, director emeritus in St. Paul's Lutheran Church Grove, Summer Hill, on Sunday, July 15 at 2:30 p.m. The Rev. Dr. Clarence A. Steigerwalt, pastor of St. Paul's, has been a pioneer in promoting numerous firsts. This is probably the first church throughout the section to sponsor a sacred band concert on a Sunday afternoon

St. Paul's, located northwest of Auburn and northeast of Summit Station, overlooks the beautiful valleys with the Blue Mountains in the distance. There is ample parking on the parking lots of the church.

Among the musical numbers, Mrs. Joan Ridler of Pottsville, the soloist, will sing "Bless This House," "The Lord's Prayer," and The Battle Hymn of the Republic." A trumpet solo, "Rock of Ages," will be given by J. Richard Zimmerman, as well as numbers by Bruce Hummel, Robert Hughes, William Rehman, and John Zimmerman. The concert will also include "The Overture in the Opera Seville," "The Barber of Seville by Rossini," "Goin' Home" from Largo of the New World Symphony by Anton Dvorak, and the male quartette consisting of overture," "In the Cathedral" by Frankheiser. Marches by John Philip Sousa will be "Hands Across the Sea," "Semper Fidelis," "The Concert March," and "Brass Pagentry" by A.E. Ostling. Edward Beck, Roy Baldinger, and Bruce Hummel will present a trumpet trio. Selections from Show Boat by Jerome Kern, Can-Can by Cole Porter, and marches by Goldman will also be among the selections.

The concert will be given for the benefit of the debt fund of the new St. Paul's Lutheran Church.
