
SPORTS report

Class Mappenings

Grade 1's have been learning about the 5 food groups. They will be doing an oral where they present a packed lunchbox with all 5 food groups. This will be their actual lunch for the day — how fun! Ms Taylor's mom came to read stories to her class — she brought them some yummy treats too! A highlight of the term — the class loved it!

Grade 2's are looking forward to going to Intaka Island National Reserve and Wetlands. The children planted bean plants in class and they grew very tall.

Grade 3's visited the Cape Town Science Centre. As always, it's an educational and fun outing, filled with science experiments, learning about Camera Obscura, plants and playing with all the fun equipment. The experiments that stood out were the ones with fire and chemicals and of course, "elephant toothpaste"! The children also conducted interviews with an older family member or friend. It was fascinating for them to learn how different a child's life was years ago, compared to their lives now. They also realised how lucky they are, when they heard how children were punished at school in years gone by!

Grade 4's made musical instruments with recyclable materials as part of NST. They also had the Bee School visit where they were given a demonstration on how honey is made. All the children had a taste of raw honey. There was a child who dressed up as a beekeeper and one dressed as a bee! They will be visiting the Centre of Conservation soon.

Grade 5's visited Little Orchard Nursery to see how plants are propagated and for a tour of the greenhouse tunnels. They each got to plant their own "spekboom". They celebrated Ancient Egypt Day dressed up as Egyptians and brought authentic snacks to share. They presented posters on well-known Pharaohs and watched a film on the tombs of the Pyramids of Giza. The children are keeping a record of the weather for the week, then they will analyse their data and produce rainfall and temperature graphs. They are also building a car from recyclable materials, and it must have wheels and axles and be able to move.

Grade 6' took part in their third Elevate Education Study Skills session this term, focusing on the use of mnemonics to strengthen memory and recall. The 75-minute practical workshop gave learners effective tools to support their study habits and build confidence in preparing for assessments. This session formed part of a year-long journey, with the final "Ace Your Exams" session to follow next term.

Grade 7's had an unforgettable outing to Groot Constantia, tying in with their History theme. They will be visiting Koeberg Power Station soon. Upcoming events include EMS Market Day for budding entrepreneurs and Career Day to tie in with their Life Orientation subject. Academic Excellence awards were handed out to 8 learners and many were recognized for social credits. Our Grade 7 Leadership Team will carry the torch for the rest of the year!
