Coronary Artery Disease

Coronary Artery Disease (CAD) develops when the major blood vessels that supply your heart become damaged or diseased. Cholesterol containing deposits (plaques) in your arteries and inflammation are usually to blame.

The coronary arteries supply blood, oxygen and nutrients to your heart. Eventually, the reduced blood flow may cause chest pain (angina), shortness of breath, or other coronary artery disease signs and symptoms. A complete blockage can cause a heart attack.

Because coronary artery disease often develops over decades, you might not notice a problem until you have a significant blockage or a heart attack. You can take steps to prevent and treat Coronary Artery Disease. A healthy lifestyle can make a big impact. Coronary Artery Disease is thought to begin with damage or injury to the inner layer of a coronary artery. Sometimes as early as childhood. The damage may be caused by various factors including:

- Smoking
- High Blood Pressure
- High Cholesterol
- Diabetes or Insulin Resistance
- Sedentary Lifestyle

Preparing for Lent and Easter**Regulations for Lent and the Easter Triduum**

1. Lent is the principal season of penance in the Christian year. Priests, religious and laity are strongly urged to develop and follow a program of voluntary self-denial, attentiveness to prayer, and especially to works of charity and mercy.
2. Everyone of 14 years of age or over is bound to abstain from meat on Ash Wednesday, February 18th, and on ALL Fridays of Lent.
3. Everyone 18 years of age and under 59 years of age is bound to fast on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday of Lent.
4. On these two days (Ash Wednesday and Good Friday) of fast and abstinence, only one full meatless meal is allowed. Two other meatless meals, sufficient to maintain strength, may be taken according to each one's needs, but together they should not equal another full meal. Eating between meals is not permitted on these two days, but liquids (including milk and fruit juices) are allowed. When health or ability to work would be seriously affected, the law does not oblige.

To disregard completely the law of fast and abstinence is a serious matter
