**Multiple Sclerosis Awareness**

March is Multiple Sclerosis Awareness Month. This is a reminder to educate yourself on MS, a worthy disease process that affects one million people in the United States. There are multiple fundraising resources that are trying to not only educate, but draw attention to Multiple Sclerosis to help people to better understand the disease.

**The following are some facts about Multiple Sclerosis:**

- It affects women more than men.
- It often hits younger ages in the range of 20-50 years old.
- Symptoms are so wide ranging and vague, often people process through life without a diagnosis.
- It is an unpredictable disease of the central nervous system (brain, spinal cord and optic nerves...it controls everything that we do).
- It disrupts the flow of information within the brain and between the brain and the rest of the body.
- It can affect different areas of the body.
- It is not curable, but it is treatable.
- The sooner one starts treatment, the less disability the patient is likely to suffer.
- Your experience with the disease may change from day to day and year to year.

**Symptoms to look for in Multiple Sclerosis:**

- Fatigue
- Memory Difficulties
- Mobility Issues
- Mood Changes
- Numbness
- Pain
- Tingling
- Vision Impairment
- Symptoms will depend on where inflammation and damage are occurring at any specific time.
