St. Isaac Jogues Church: \$7,303.00

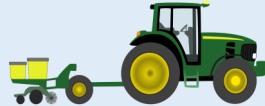

Make Farm Safety A Top Priority This Harvest Season

Fall Harvest, which kicks off in mid-September, is one of the busiest and most dangerous seasons of the year for agricultural workers. This agricultural sector is one of the most dangerous in America, with over 450 fatalities each year, according to the U.S. Bureau of Labor Statistics' recent data. For that reason, America has recognized the third week of September as National Farm Safety and Health since 1944.



Remember: There is a no healthy farm without a healthy farmer heading the operation.

Some Tips To Help Keep Yourself & Loves Ones Safe:

- Working all hours of the day, often in isolation, takes a toll on one's body. Be mindful of your mental state, as it is to ensure your physical safety.
- Take note of how your body reacts to stress. Look out for signs of fatigue such as: drowsiness, dizziness, headaches, vision impairments, and poor circulation.
- Find 5-10 minutes to relax and recharge, so that you can provide yourself that mental refresher that you may need.
- Fall harvest ultimately means more farm equipment on the road. If you've never been in the seat of a combine or tractor, you may not realize how difficult it is for farmers to see other vehicles while driving between fields. It is important for both farmers and motorists to stay diligent and keep one another safe during the busy season.
- Keep slow moving signs and lights clean on your vehicles. Dirt or debris covering critical safety features can lower equipment visibility and potentially deposit illegal and dangerous obstacles on the road.
- Motorists need to watch for any hazards that may fall off of farm equipment. Keep yourself at a safe distance in case that this would happen. Allow yourself time to react to avoid a serious accident.
- When approaching an intersection, proceed with extreme caution. It is hard to see around the corn fields, along with combines, tractors and trucks that are in or along the fields or roadways.
- Remain several car lengths back and remember to have patience with those who are driving this large equipment.
- Before passing, remember to look for a clear signal from the person in the cab of the combine or tractor. Pass only when it is safe and legal to do so.
- Be prepared to encounter slow-moving vehicles not only in the day, but at night.
- Farmers won't be the only ones hitting the road this fall. Truck drivers also play a critical role in the supply chain by transporting the food, fuel and fiber that each of us depends on.
- Please avoid being on your phones, especially when traveling down rural roads.
- Watch out for deer and other animals that may be in the fields. They are often started by the loud farm equipment and run out onto the roadways.
