

## What Do The Symbols Of Christmas Mean?

Candy Cane: Shepherds used crooks to bring lambs back into the field. Candy canes remind us we are all our brother's keeper. Christ is called the Good Shepherd.

**Bell:** Sheep wear bells so the shepherd can easily locate them. Bells remind us to locate those in need and to bring them into the fold. Also, for centuries bells have been used to announce special events.





Star: The most familiar Christmas symbol. They represent the Star of Bethlehem which guided the Wisemen to the Christ Child. They remind us that we should diligently seek Him every day.

**Evergreen Tree:** For centuries, the evergreen tree has been a common symbol of eternal life. It reminds us that because of the sacrifice of Jesus Christ, we will all enjoy eternal life. It points to Heaven and reminds us that God is eternal.





**The Wreath:** The circle is a symbol of eternity, having no beginning and no end. A wreath combines evergreen bough in a circle as a symbol of never ending love. They remind us that God's love for us never ends, just as ours should never end for Him.


**Candles:** One of the most common symbols in the world. At Christmas time, they shine brightly, showing us that Jesus is the light of the world.






**Gifts:** Symbolize gold, frankincense and myrrh. Christmas gifts symbolize the generosity of God through Jesus' birth.
