ARRL Club Commission Program

The ARRL Club Commission Program is designed to reward clubs for encouraging ARRL membership and is a successful program that can add some cash to your club's bank account. It is not difficult to do and the responsibility for administrating this program is an easy task for your

club treasurer or other office holder. The club can earn \$5.00 for every ARRL membership renewal processed by your club and if you have an individual who is a new ARRL member (new is defined as never having been an ARRL member or has not been an ARRL member for two full years or longer), your club can pick up a crisp \$20 bill for every new ARRL member that you can get signed up.

The program is designed for your members to renew or sign up through your ARRL Affiliated club. If they join on their own, your club will not get the \$\$. See QST for more details.

Go Kits

With the spring weather upon us, it is a good time to check that weather radio to ensure that it is in good working order with fresh batteries. Now is a good time to air out that dusty 'go kit' to make sure that you have fresh batteries for flashlights and other battery powered items. How about that HT? How good is the battery on that radio? Do you

have a power supply that enables you to run off 12V DC or AC and charge the battery if needed? Where is that Orange/Yellow traffic vest? How about a jacket to keep you warm and dry and a hat to keep the sun off you? Maybe some sunscreen. Do you have an extra vest in your car? Do you have current maps of your county and cities (if applicable)? How about a couple of tablets and plenty of fresh pens to write with? Do you have a list of repeaters for all counties surrounding your own? Are they programmed into your mobile rig as well as your HT? Can you remember how to enter a new frequency into your HT? Can you put that frequency into a memory slot? Do you have a blanket and some bottled water and some sealed snacks that could tide you over if you end up out in the boonies

on assignment for several hours? You get my drift by now. Preparation is key to a successful (and safe) deployment. Plan ahead.....
