

Fine Arts Preschool FAQ



What can I expect from the Fine Arts Preschool program?

Fine Arts Preschool offers an arts education in dance, art, drama, music, yoga, and other specialized activities that will stimulate creative thinking, problem solving, and artistry! A normal day will total 3 hours and includes Fine Arts activities and academic learning to develop cognitive, social, emotional, and fine motor skills. Your child will explore arts and academics through monthly themes that build confident, strong, and independent human beings ready to take on Kindergarten!

How is your Fine Arts program different from a regular preschool or daycare?

In our program, learning comes alive through the arts! Instead of keeping art separate, we weave dance, music, drama, and visual art right into literacy, math, science, SEL and more. Our teachers turn the classroom into a place of creativity and discovery, where projects connect to big ideas, spark imagination, and offer pathways to deeper learning. With this playful, holistic approach, students don't just learn — they explore, create, and have fun every step of the way!

What does it cost?

How do I know if this program is right for my child?

Does your child light up when they sing, dance, or get creative? Would you like to nurture your child's confidence, build their focus, and develop their social skills to prepare them for Kindergarten and beyond? At Fine Arts Preschool, we blend learning with movement, music, theater, art, and more—giving preschoolers a safe, exciting space to grow, explore, and connect with others. Perfect for hands-on, visual, and kinesthetic learners, our program keeps kids moving with fun activities, frequent breaks, and plenty of creative outlets. If your little one loves to explore, wiggle, or dive into projects, they'll feel right at home here!

Can I make up a class if I miss one?

Yes—make-ups are available in the form of a dance class. Contact our admin team to find a dance class that fits your schedule within the same school year.

How do I pay tuition?

Tuition for the program is charged monthly and will be automatically drafted from your account on the 1st of the month.



What can I expect during drop-off? Am I able to stay?

Our teachers are trained in early childhood development and experienced in supporting children through separation anxiety. We encourage parents to say their goodbyes and allow teachers to guide children into class. For first-time attendees, it's normal for children to take time to feel comfortable—some may cry for 5–20 minutes during the first few weeks. On the first day, you are welcome to stay for the first 30 minutes. Our detailed integration policy is outlined in the parent handbook. Our goal is to help your child feel safe, confident, and inspired, and we will call you if your child needs extra support. Thank you for trusting us with this important transition.

How many children are in the class?

We accept 10 students in each class.

What does my child need for the class?

- Water bottle and a nut free snack
- Extra clothes, accidents do happen
- Dance shoes or socks with grips, bare feet are also great
- Name on all back-packs, lunch bags, and water bottles.

What are the age requirements?

Our program is designed for children ages 3–5. There are some exceptions to this rule on a case by case basis since every child develops differently.

How do you communicate with parents?

We send out monthly newsletters via email, provide regular updates and share pictures on a private app called band, have yearly parent-teacher conferences, and teachers provide consistent verbal check-ins. You can always schedule a 1:1 meeting with a teacher if more discussion time is needed.

What if I need to withdraw my child from the program?

Students may withdraw with written notice if given by the 15th of the month. If notice is received after the 15th you will still be billed for the following month as you are taking a spot in the program.

Does my child need to be potty trained?

Yes they have to be potty trained and able to pull their pants up and down independently in the bathroom.
