

2026 National Assisted Living Costs

A Clear & Simple Breakdown for Families

Making decisions about assisted living is emotional enough.

Understanding the costs shouldn't feel overwhelming too.

Here is a straightforward look at what families are seeing across the country in 2026.

National Assisted Living Costs (2026)

National Median Base Rate (Monthly):

\$5,900 – \$6,313

National Median Base Rate (Annual):

\$70,800 – \$75,756

Typical Real Monthly Cost After Care Add-Ons:

\$8,000+ per month

National Median Including Memory Care:

\$8,019 per month

State Cost Ranges (2026 Estimates)

Lower-Cost States

(Mississippi, Alabama, Arkansas)

\$4,481 – \$5,012 per month

\$53,772 – \$60,144 annually

Higher-Cost States

(Hawaii, Alaska, Massachusetts)

\$9,610 – \$12,000 per month

\$115,320 – \$144,000 annually

Most Mid-Range States Fall Between:

\$5,000 – \$7,500 per month

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Memory Care Costs

If your parent needs memory support, there is typically an additional monthly charge.

Memory Care Add-On:

\$2,000 – \$4,000 per month

This often brings total monthly costs to:

\$8,000 – \$10,000+ per month

The Hidden & Added Costs Families Don't Always Expect

Many families plan for the “base rate.”

But that's rarely the full picture.

Here are some of the most common additional charges:

Tiered Care Levels

Most communities use a level or points system.

For example:

Moving from Level 1 (minimal assistance) to Level 2 (help with bathing or dressing) can add \$1,500+ per month.

Care levels are reassessed regularly — and costs can increase.

Medication Management

Medication reminders or administration services typically cost:

\$200 – \$800+ per month

Pricing depends on the number of medications and complexity.

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Upfront Community Fee

Most communities charge a one-time move-in fee.

Typical range:
\$2,500 – \$5,000

Luxury communities may charge significantly more.

Additional Service Fees

These smaller charges add up quickly:

- In-room meal delivery: \$10 – \$25 per meal
- Personal laundry services: \$100 – \$200 per month
- Escort services to dining or activities: additional fee
- Incontinence supplies purchased through facility: \$200 – \$300+ per month

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Understanding Pricing Models

Not all communities structure pricing the same way.

Here are the three most common models:

All-Inclusive Model

One single monthly fee covers housing and care.

- ✓ Predictable
- ✓ Easier budgeting
- ✗ May be more than needed for someone requiring minimal care

Tiered Pricing Model (Most Common)

Base rent plus assigned care level fee.

- ✓ Flexible at first
- ✗ Costs can increase suddenly after reassessments

À La Carte Model

Base rent plus individual service charges.

- ✓ Budget-friendly initially
- ✗ Can become very expensive as care needs increase

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Questions Every Family Should Ask Before Signing

Before making a decision, consider asking:

- How often are care levels reassessed?
- What specifically triggers a move to the next tier?
- Is the community fee refundable?
- What services are NOT included in the base rent?
- What would this realistically cost if care needs increase over the next 12-24 months?
