

# **From the Pastor**

### WISE MEN FROM THE EAST

After Jesus was born in Bethlehem in Judea, during the time of King Magi from the east came Herod. to Jerusalem and asked. "Where is the one who has been born king of the Jews? We saw his star when it rose and have come to worship him." When King Herod heard this he was disturbed, and all Jerusalem with him. When he had called together all the people's chief priests and teachers of the law, he asked them where the Messiah was to be born. "In Bethlehem in Judea," they replied, "for this is what the prophet has written:

"'But you, Bethlehem, in the land of Judah, are by no means least among the rulers of Judah; for out of you will come a ruler who will shepherd my people Israel.""


### GENEROSITY LITURGY Taken from a Women's Bible Study book "Luke in the Land" by Kristi McLelland

### Walking with Those Who Grieve

The holiday season can be difficult for people who are grieving a death or deep loss. As Christians, we do well to be aware that not everyone feels wholehearted joy this time of year. How can we support them?

Grief counselor Alan Wolfelt explains that walking alongside — "companioning" — one who grieves "is not about assessing, analyzing, fixing or resolving another's grief. Instead, it is about being totally present to the mourner, even being a temporary guardian of [his or] her soul." Among Wolfelt's 11 tenets for "companioning the bereaved":

- It's about being present to another person's pain, not taking it away.
- It's about listening with the heart, not analyzing with the head.
- It's about walking alongside, not leading.

### **The Incarnation**

At the center of Christmas is Jesus, both fully God and fully man. "In Bethlehem, humility and glory in their extremes were joined," wrote pastor R.G. Lee (1886-1978). When Jesus

came to earth, Lee explained, he descended:

from the heights of glory to the depths of shame,

from the wonders of heaven to the wickedness of earth,

from exaltation to humiliation,

from the throne to the tree,

from dignity to debasement,

from worship to wrath,

from the halls of heaven to the nails of earth,

from the coronation to the curse,

from the glory place to the gory place!

"Born in a stable! Cradled in a cattle trough! Wrapped in swaddling clothes of poverty!" Lee wrote. "No room for him who made all rooms! [No] place for him who made and knows all places! Oh, deep humiliation of the Creator — born of the creature, woman! But in his descent was the dawn of mercy. Because we cannot ascend to him, he descends to us."

### Make this Christmas craft to display special names for Jesus.


### What you need:

- Large wooden craft stick
- Small green wooden craft sticks
- Scissors
- Ruler
- Bible
- Permanent marker
- Craft glue
- Optional: star stickers or craft jewels

### What you do:

- Place the large stick on a table vertically, like a tree trunk.
- Cut the green sticks into pieces that measure 4", 3%", 3" and 2%".
- On each green stick, write a name for Jesus from Isaiah 9:5 — Wonderful Counselor, Mighty God, Everlasting Father, Frince of Peace. (Write small or ask an adult for help.)
- Use a dot of glue to attach each green stick to the large stick, like tree branches.
- 5. Decorate your Christmas tree with stickers or jewels.


