From the Pastor

Back in 1961, when I was a ten years old, and in the fourth grade at Applegate Elementary School in Crow, Oregon, my teacher noticed I had trouble reading things on the black board. She told me I was probably near-sighted and needed glasses and told me to tell my parents I needed an eye exam. I mentioned this to my parents at supper one evening and my father took off his glasses and told me to put them on. "Holy mackerel!" I exclaimed, as the world of fuzzy shapes suddenly came into focus. I was amazed. I had no idea that my perception of the world - its real quality - was so far from reality.

That incident has always been a lesson for me in how far off one can be with assumptions about reality. Not just physical reality but mental, social, and especially spiritual reality. The following is an imaginary encounter between a young lad and Jesus.

A ten-year-old boy comes to Jesus and asks to join his Kingdom of God movement. Jesus smiles at him and asks him, "Son, you are welcome, come and sit with us." The boy sits down next to Jesus and nervously looks around at the rough-looking men who make up Jesus' inner circle. He thinks he needs to prove himself to them and to Jesus. "Look at my report card," he says, "I've got an A- in Loving God above all things!" Jesus smiles at him and asks, "What are your other marks, young man?" The boy reads off the whole report card: "Loving neighbors as oneself: B+; Obeying and honoring my parents: C+," and

so on. Now all the men are smiling with Jesus and there seems to the boy to be an inside joke they all know but he doesn't. Jesus asks the boy, "Who made this report card?" "I did," the boy replies. "I see." Jesus replies, "There's a problem." "What problem?" inquires the boy. "Here," says Jesus, "these are my Father's glasses. Put them on and look at your record." The boy puts on the glasses and looks at the grades. He is appalled! After every category there is a big red "F". He has failed completely. "Do you see the problem, my son?" Jesus asks the boy. The boy looks at Jesus in confused apprehension. "You don't ... you can't see yourself as you really are," Jesus tells him. "O my God! What can I do?" exclaims the boy. Jesus responds with, "It's not a question of what you can do, but what I am doing and will do for you. I'm going to nail that report card, with all the F's on it, to my cross along with all your sins. I'm going to give you my report card - it's what you need to be in my kingdom and be a part of its life and ministry. See, it's all A's, a perfect 4.0! This is yours as my gift to you if you'll have it. Take it, and follow me."

The boy rips up his self-made report card and holds Jesus' report card to his chest. His joy is almost too much to bear.

"For it is by grace you have been saved, through faith - and this not from yourselves, it is the gift of God - not by works, so that no one can boast." Ephesians 2:8-9



Hungry for Jesus

At Bible.org, pastor Steven J. Cole writes, "Starving people

aren't interested in new smart phones or computers, unless they can somehow sell them to buy food. Hungry people have one focus — where to find food. It consumes their whole existence. ... That's how we should hunger for God!"



Spiritual hunger leads to a feast of God's blessings. He generously gives us gifts that overflow into the lives of others. So let's share Jesus with people who are starving for him!


JESUS LEADS THE WAY

The all-powerful God of the universe submitting willingly to having all power away. How stripped could that be imaginable? Even more, how could that be true?



Veterans Day Salute

After fighting in World War II, Luther Bergeland wasn't done serving his country or his God. The Minnesota farm boy, who ** DAY ** "came back to faith" during combat, later served for decades as a military chaplain. For his actions in the field in Korea, Bergeland

was awarded the Bronze Star. Then during Vietnam, he served in the Army Reserves in Colorado, tasked with informing family members about soldiers' deaths.

Despite the challenges, Bergeland embraces the special role he was able to play for four decades, sharing Jesus and his love with countless people. "That's what we did, preaching and reaching out to people," he told a reporter. "I always liked the military very much because it just did a lot for me, and I hope I did a lot for it."






What you do:

- On the stens, write an attribute of God (loving, wise, powerful, merciful, etc.).
- 5. Repeat with more stones. Use them as gifts, paperweights, table decorations, etc.


