Pastor's Letter

Do you have a favorite memory of Spring? Allow me to share one of my favorites. I often wait to go fly fishing, here in Montana, for the first time in a new year in late April. Green-up has begun. I like a nice warm day, with no wind, to go out for the first fishing excursion. One of my favorite spots to wade fish is where Sheep Creek empties into the Missouri River across I-15 from Tower Rock. After rigging up my rod and getting all my gear in place, I walk from the Fishing Access Site parking lot through the newly leafed-out cottonwoods and other deciduous trees. The aroma of these trees and other newly sprouted plants is almost intoxicating. To fill one's lungs with this natural elixir is a delightful experience after a long Montana winter. Perhaps you have similar "Ah, Spring!" experiences.

Moving from the natural delights of springtime to the spiritual delight we may experience in this life, I have been blessed with times of refreshment after long spells of "trudging through the snow". We can get weary of the troubles, disappointments, and hardships of life. Hopes can fade away, loved ones and friends pass away. The dark things in our cultural environment may wear us down. It's like the experience of the disciples of Jesus after his crucifixion, death, and burial. The forlorn disciples whom the resurrected Jesus met on the road to Emmaus had downcast faces as they told him, " ... we had hoped that he was the one who was going to redeem Israel (Luke 24:21)." Jesus responded with, "How foolish you are, and slow of heart to believe all that the prophets have spoken! Did not the Christ have to suffer these things and then enter his glory?"



Darkness, suffering, death, all that saps life from us is not the greatest reality. The resurrected Jesus has overcome all of that and has entered New Creation glory. That ultimate spiritual refreshment is yet in our future. But even now we may be caught up into it by faith. Pondera Valley had a council meeting March 4th. Pastor Stoopes said that he would have first communion classes in

April as well as new member classes if there is an interest. The Education board will have a couple of meetings soon to cover vacation Bible school and scholarships. The Building & Grounds will buy a new vacuum for the church. They will also be getting a price quote for the installation of LED lights in the sanctuary. The call committee has updated the information online. There are no candidates at this time. The council finalized the details for the special congregational meeting on April 14th. The pictorial directory is moving along. The *chairs* have been ordered. There will be a *special offering taken for them on April 21st and 28th.* Lenten lunches continue and will finish on March 21st. Golden West will have a council meeting on April 9th at 9 a.m.

The next PV Council meeting will be Monday, April 8th at 6:30 p.m.

SPECIAL CONGREGATIONAL MEETING SCHEDULED

Voting members should have or will be receiving a letter in the mail soon calling for a special congregational meeting by Pondera Valley Lutheran Church Council. The meeting will be held **following 10 a.m. Worship on Sunday, April 14, 2024**.

To meet the needs for a future pastor, Pondera Valley Lutheran Church (PVLC) Council is asking the PVLC Congregation for the authority to expedite the sale of the existing parsonage and for the purchase of a new home. A larger family size home would be purchased as the new parsonage. The council would not sell the existing parsonage until a suitable new home was found. To expedite the purchase of a new parsonage, a loan is needed to bridge the gap between the purchase price of the new home minus cash on hand designated for the parsonage. After the loan is secured and a new home purchased, the existing parsonage (the Montgomery House) will be sold. Funds

received from the sale of the Montgomery House will be used to pay down the loan. The council is asking you to support this request by voting yes to the following proposal:

"Pondera Valley Lutheran Church (PVLC), by no less than a 2/3 majority vote of the members present and voting at a legally called meeting of the congregation (with a quorum of at least 30 members present), grants the PVLC Council the authority to purchase a new home, the authority to secure a loan for the purchase of a new parsonage, and the authority to sell the existing parsonage, called the Montgomery House."

Please plan to attend the special congregational meeting on Sunday, April 14, 2024 following the 10 a.m. Worship. Pray for the future of the PVLC congregation, the call committee, council, and for a future pastor.
