He who supplies seed to the sower and bread for food will supply and multiply your seed for sowing and increase the harvest of your righteousness. You will be enriched in every way to be generous in every

way, which through us will produce thanksgiving to God. 2 Cor. 9:10-11 In this brief passage of scripture, Paul gives us several important lessons concerning our giving. First, it is God who supplies our needs. God gives us both seed to sow and bread for food. Second, multiplication only takes place in our lives when we sow the seed that God gives us.

In the natural world any farmer knows that every crop harvest has two purposes. One is food and the other is seed that should be used to produce a crop for next year.

In the area of our finances, these two purposed are still relevant for us today.

- 1. God gives us financial resources to enjoy; that is bread for food.
- 2. God gives us financial resources for the purpose of sowing; that is seed for sowing in order that we receive our next harvest.

It is only when we sow that God promises multiplication. Therefore, as believers we have the wonderful opportunity to enjoy a portion of God's resources in our own lives; and also to sow a portion of these resources into the lives of others.

When we are obedient, then our resources are continually multiplied, and at the same time the church and others are blessed by our giving.
