

It is a privilege each year to share with you what my family has been up to. We have been here in Conrad with you only two and a half years. I forget Madelyn was born the first summer we got here. Now she runs around with the rest of the kids in her violet glasses. Abigail is already in kindergarten, a girl scout, and getting smart. Kori and I can barely keep up with them.

A highlight for our family this year would have been the short time we spent in Whitehall. I was invited to officiate at a beautiful wedding, and in our down time we went exploring. Nearby was a place called the "Ringing Rocks." There we went to hear how when hit, these boulders would sharply chime. We were able to drive almost all the way to them. Parking at a spot just below the last ascent, the walk up was rocky, moderately steep, and about a block. At the base was waiting a whole rack of hammers for you to try your percussion abilities on the rusty red rocks.

We crawled all over and even to the peak of the pile to test the frequency of every ring. When you would strike them with a hammer the rocks would cry out acutely. It even started raining on us on our way up, but the consensus was we that we kept on going. At one point we huddled together in a cleft to wait out the worst of it. Yet, when we got to the top we knew why we had got there. Our family sat together at the highest point of those stacked up boulders and I realized how good we really have it despite all the difficult times.

The sky around us became beautiful. Other families began arriving. Their joyful noise joined ours as kids began to play together. Perhaps it is one of those scenes you will never forget as a parent. Ironically, after getting to the top struggling with stumbling and suffering the storm we saw all the people around us beginning the same way up, while right behind us was a simple path to step directly to the peak. So, from the top we called out to them saying, "There is another way up! Follow that path and you will be brought right here with us."

Some listened while others continued the path they had picked. We began our descent, called to continue our own journey. Together we went along that path at peace and knowing the love each of us had and needed. Reflecting on that event as I write this I now realize what message was being

given. Luke 19:40 Jesus says, "I tell you, if they keep silent, the stones will cry out." The point is that with this Christmas season I pray with my whole family that you hear that we are no longer waiting. Jesus has arrived on earth for all of us with the whole kingdom. If we do not announce it the rocks will. Our opportunity as believers is in everyday life to give the whole kingdom to those we are called to love. Let it change you, your life, and your whole household.

As I sat with my family there, all I could do was thank God for that moment. I knew He was with us and had given us the joy and peace we go about life with. We pray you are set free this Christmas season and hear what is being announced. Know there is nothing that can hold back Jesus from this world. That reality changes everything today and now. Certainly, we look forward to the day Jesus will arrive again, but realize that we can live confidently knowing what is going to happen. The whole world was given as a gift to us by God from the beginning. Our Father is the most generous giver because all that we have is received from Him. Even when nothing is left he will provide us with eternal life as heirs to the whole kingdom. There is no gift or message on earth that matches the Good News of what Jesus has done for you and given.

By Christ alone my family lives and we are so thankful for Jesus arrival this Christmas season. We are surely blessed and with praise and thanksgiving give glory to God the Father. May the Spirit continue to work in us as we hope to give you God's whole blessing in this wonderful place we have been called to. Immanuel means God with us, so, peace be with you, do not be afraid, take courage, have joy, the whole kingdom is with you this Christmas and every day. Forgiveness, rescue from evil, and salvation to eternal life are yours, if you believe God's promise fulfilled only through Jesus Christ. He is the way, truth, and life to more than the top of a pile of rocks, mountaintop, any skyscraper you might make, or space we shoot up into. Jesus brings us to the Father's Kingdom and in faith we can constantly tell the whole world what he has done and promised for us all. If we do not, the rocks will ring out. May hope, faith, joy, peace and the presence of Jesus Christ be with you this season and throughout your life so you may give the best gift, the Gospel, to neighbor and enemy.


Make this craft to remember God's many blessings.

- What you need: • Small stones
 - Permanent markers

 - Foil pan and cooking spray
- Drop cloth
- Gloves
- Quick-set concrete (and adult help)
- Bucket and paint stirrer

What you do:

- 1. After reflecting on the past year, use markers to decorate stones with memorable words, dates and drawings.
- 2. Spray pan with cooking spray. Set pan outside on a drop cloth.
- 3. Wearing gloves, mix concrete in a bucket, according to instructions.
- 4. Pour concrete into pan. Smooth top with paint stirrer.
- 5. Press in stones, handprints and other decorations.
- 6. Let dry completely. Remove from pan.
- 7. Place the stepping-stone outside as a reminder of God's continued goodness.

Apparently, God prefers partnership to acting solo. From the beginning, God has invited people to name the animals, tend the garden, welcome strangers, build the tabernacle, proclaim His



Joint Council Meeting on Dec. 3rd at Golden West. Steve and Rona Matheson and Karen and Roland Lee were approved to be the Pastoral Relations Committee. Pastor announced that Augustana Dist. will have a conference in Bloomington, MN February 3rd & 4th and the NW District Annual Gathering will be in Post Falls ID May 1st & 2nd.

The compensation package was approved. Pondera Valley will have their Annual meeting January 26th following 11 am Worship and a Potluck. (Golden West will have 9 am Worship that day only.) Golden West will have their Annual meeting on February 9th with their Waffle Dinner. Annual reports are due the end of December. The parish has

dropped their copyright subscription so there will be no copying non-public material.

Pondera Valley Council met following the joint meeting. The Education board reported that 22 were enrolled for Wednesday nights. Building & Grounds will be looking at light at entrance to Ed. Building. Custodian will be needed for the Ed. Building. Troy Shirley will be resigning his post on the council at the annual meeting. Worship Committee will try a new service out of the With One Voice hymnal. Thank you to be sent to the City of Conrad for snow removal for a funeral. February 29th (Leap Day!) has been set for the Lutefisk Dinner. There will be sign up sheets for different areas of help needed. There will be no Christmas Day service. It was approved that Kim will be out of the office Dec. 30-Jan. 2. The annual budget was presented. The meeting was

dismissed as it was getting late. The next meeting was scheduled for a few days later, December 9th. At the Dec. 9th meeting the council discussed the concern of the low balance of the treasury. The council will be watching spending and continue to have discussions concerning the funds. There was some discussion on snow removal. The proposed budget for 2020 was approved to present at the annual meeting. Janitorial needs were tabled until a later meeting. A Reimbursement Policy Resolution was presented by Lyn Carlson, discussed and approved. Pastor presented a proposed Lenten Lunch schedule to the Presbyterians and the Catholics and is waiting to hear back from them. The meeting was adjourned. The next council meeting will follow the annual meeting, January 26th.
