Pastor's Letter

Greetings and blessings as we begin a new year! My prayer for all of you is that our Lord Jesus -- Immanuel -- will be with you as the powerful, life-giving presence he intends to be for your salvation, your redemption, your re-creation.

During the month of January we will focus our attention on the Christian discipline of stewardship. A sermon series will be preached over the five Sundays of January with Rev. John Cross, pastor at Selbu Lutheran Church (LCMC) LaCrosse, Washington, preaching on January 15.

Stewardship, as understood in the Christian tradition is the exercise of the calling and responsibility that all Christians have in maintaining and wisely using all God's good gifts in accordance with His will. This is the spiritual definition of the term derived from the scriptures and traditions of ancient Israel and the Christian church. It is different from secular ideas of stewardship which leave out any reference to the divine will. They merely speak of supervising or taking care of something such as an organization or property or the environment. The topic of environmental stewardship is much debated these days as to objectives and policy. Since God's good gifts in the created order are necessarily our concern, as His stewards, we must attend to all of them as wisely as we can.

Stewardship in the Christian tradition has often been focused on our time, talents, material possessions and money. Biblical stewardship certainly addresses all these but is more comprehensive as it includes stewardship of the scriptures, of spiritual gifts and, as St. Paul affirms in 1 Corinthians 4:1, " ... the mysteries of God.

The chief "mystery" being those things hidden from time immemorial but revealed to the human race with the coming of Christ -including the Gospel itself.

The sermon series will have the following themes: 1) Stewardship of Mind and Body;

- Stewardship of Time and Talents:
- 3) Stewardship of Money and Possessions;
- 4) Stewardship of Creation; 5) Stewardship of the Mysteries of God.

These themes overlap at various points but this scheme is offered as a way to help us think clearly and act faithfully as stewards of all God's good gifts. Please pray for Pastor John Cross and me as we prepare these messages. Thank you and Happy New Year!
