At Pondera Valley, the council is beginning to look at all the suggestions that have come in to improve, maintain, and fix different areas of our church.

We appreciate your ideas and ask for your continued support through prayer and financial commitment to our church, its ministries and facilities.

In the last few months, \$10,700 was paid for 7 vacu-vents to be put in the roof! over the Fellowship Hall. This was needed maintenance. Also, recently the council

voted to approve a sound system upgrade which will cost approximately \$2,300. The benefits of this purchase will benefit many areas of our church: allowing the choir access to mp3 music for accompaniment, recording services for the possibility in future to post them on our website, provides a better radio broadcast and provides a platform to provide music if an organist/pianist isn't available.

We will continue to prayerfully utilize the funds we have and the needs presented. Thank you for your prayers and financial support as we all go forward for His glory.

Here's a wonderful piece of wisdom from C.S. Lewis:


"No sooner do we believe that God loves us than there is an impulse to believe that He does so, not because He is LOVE, but because we are intrinsically lovable. The pagans obeyed this impulse unabashed; a good man was 'dear to the gods' because he was good. We, being better taught, resort to subterfuge. Far be it from us to think that we have virtues for which God could love us. But then, how magnificently we have repented! As Bunyan says, describing his first and illusory conversion, 'I thought there was no man in England that pleased God better than I.' Beaten out of this, we next offer our own humility to God's admiration. Surely He'll like that? Or if not that, our clear-sighted and humble recognition that we still lack humility. Thus, depth beneath depth and subtlety within subtlety, there remains some lingering idea of our own, our very own, attractiveness. It is easy to acknowledge, but almost impossible to realize for long, that we are mirrors whose brightness, if we are bright, is wholly derived from the sun that shines upon us."



KEEP TRYING


In The God Who Stays, contemporary Christian musician Matthew West writes about the pandemic's fear-filled early days. After his concert tour was abruptly canceled in March 2020, he rode to an airport "feeling utterly hopeless about a world that was spinning out of control."

Then Arthur, his ride-share driver, began singing along to the radio — and the song happened to be West's "The God Who Stays." West joined in, jokingly asking how he sounded. "Not so good," Arthur replied, not knowing West's identity. "You keep trying."

The driver shared how those lyrics uplifted him during life's difficulties, and West later recalled that conversation during lockdown, while wondering where God was. The musician realized he had "settled for a socially distant relationship with the One who is nearer than I dare to believe, closer than the air I breathe." But West pictured "God running toward me with open arms like the prodigal's father," and he resolved to keep trying — and to grow closer to the God who always stays.

A sprinkle of pepper and a dab of soap illustrate a big concept from God's Word.




What you need:

- · Shallow dish
- Water
- · Black ground pepper
- Toothpick
- Dish soap
- Bible

What you do:

- 1. With the dish on a table, fill it halfway with water. Don't jiggle the dish.
- 2. Sprinkle pepper on the water.
- 3. Dab the toothpick into a drop of soap. Then touch its tip to the center of the water and observe.
- 4. Read Psalm 103:8-12. How does this experiment illustrate God's forgiveness?
- 5. Explain the science behind this experiment: The soap disturbs the water's surface tension. The soap molecules don't want to interact with the water. This repels the water molecules from the soap, causing the floating pepper to also move to the sides.




