



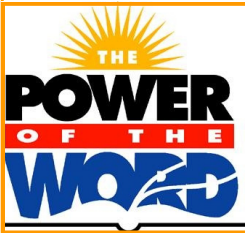

“A season for...”

Brothers and sisters in Christ,

Grace and Peace to you from God the Father and Our Lord Jesus Christ,

Winter has sure arrived. Lent has also begun. We are in distinct times concerning both the church year and regular calendar. From experience many of us know already what this season holds for us. Ash Wednesday starts by reminding us that we are created out of dust and to it we will return. The following weeks call for giving to the poor, prayer, and fasting. It is a simple pattern to remind us that every part of life was first given to us as a gift. From beginning to end and every bit between God sustains solely. This was done out of love and our imitation of it is to give to others just as we have been given.

The point of Jesus extreme measures, such as telling the rich young ruler to give away everything, is to expose where we lack faith. In that same instant we should hear that Jesus has done that very thing for us. The practice of almsgiving is a simple reminder that nothing can give what Jesus offers for free. Fasting reminds me that I have never truly hungered or thirsted for anything. We are so generously provided for that we can choose to go without due to liberty. Yet, none of this can be done in faith without knowing God's promises. There we face even negative temperatures without terror.

Consequently, the emphasis of prayer may be the most impactful for me during the winter and Lent season. The promises have to be called upon with earnestness and sincerity, and we have been told to do this

without ceasing. Praying leads us to see the whole narrative from beginning to finale. Every need can be brought to the altar and in the end we will be led to Palm Sunday, Holy Week, and Easter. As always, the Word will reveal Jesus Christ and all he has done for us. There we will be able to rest in His presence knowing that the Father is well pleased with each of us. I pray the Holy Spirit be with each and everyone of us as we hear the call to pick up our cross everyday to follow Jesus. Peace be with you.

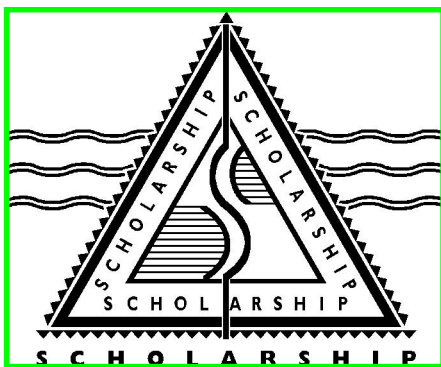

The Palm Sunday anthem "All Glory Laud and Honor" is one of Christendom's oldest hymns. St. Theodulf of Orleans, who helped reform the church under Charlemagne, wrote the lyrics in the year 820 while imprisoned in France. The lyrics recount Jesus' triumphal entry into Jerusalem, an event the medieval church reenacted every Palm Sunday. Clergy and townspeople processed from fields through the city gates, behind a Jesus figure riding a donkey. At the gates, children began singing the hymn in Latin — *Gloria, laus et honor* — and onlookers soon chimed in. City gates may be a thing of the past, as

the website Hymnary.org notes, yet we still praise our blessed Redeemer "because we know just what kind of King he was and is — an everlasting King who reigns not just in Jerusalem but over the entire earth. What more could we do but praise him with glory, laud and honor."

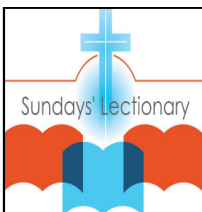

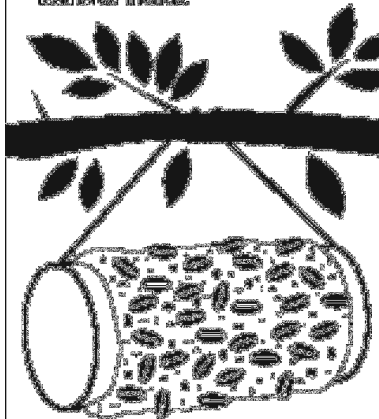

Display this recycled craft to care for feathered friends.



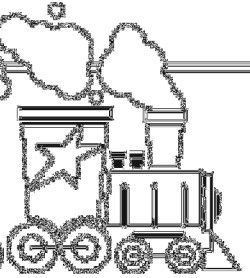
### What you need:

May you never forget that God is a loving Father! Amen.



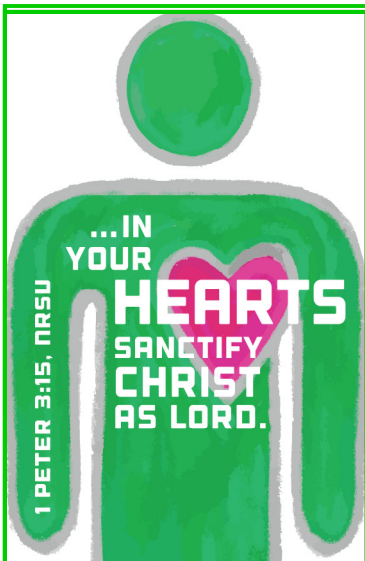

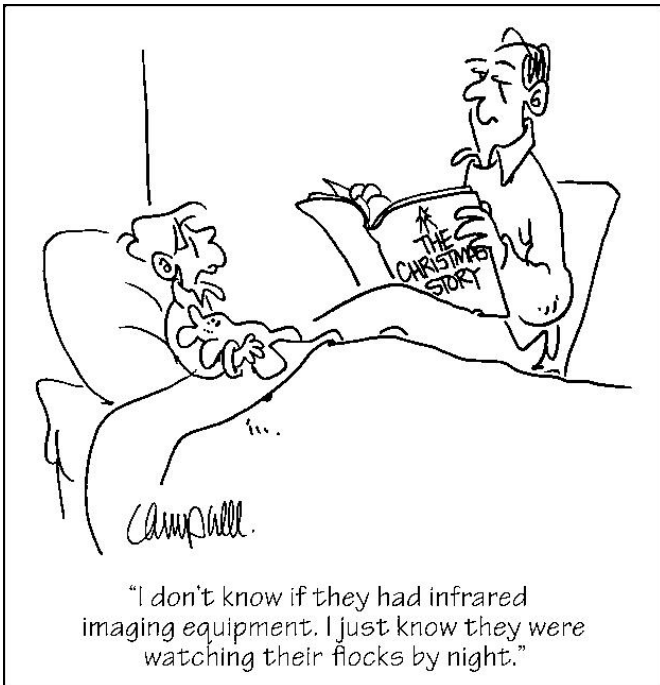

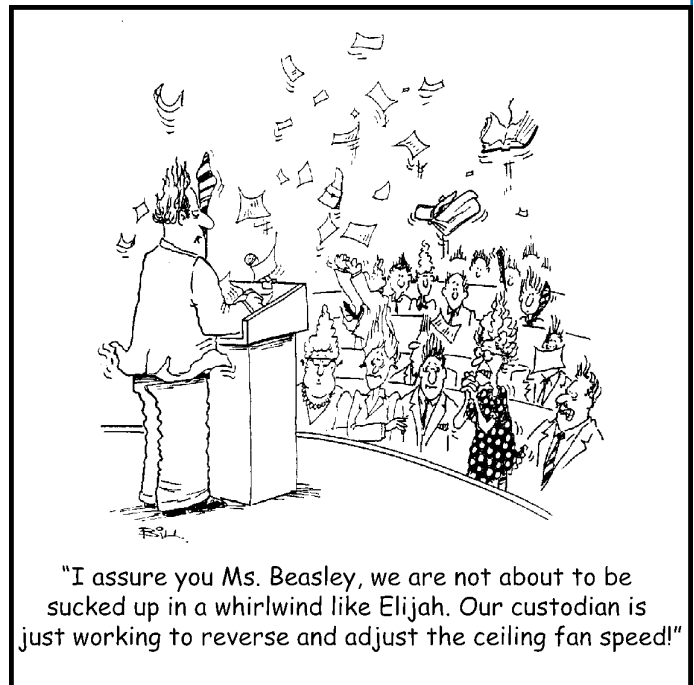

Though St. Patrick's Day has become a secular "holiday," March 17 commemorates the life of a Christian missionary. St. Patrick grew up in a Christian home in Britain but wasn't very devout until he experienced crisis. As a teen, he was captured and sold into slavery in Ireland, escaping after six years. "The Lord opened my unbelieving eyes" in Ireland, Patrick later said. God led him back there, and he converted tribe after tribe to Christianity.

In *Confessio 61*, St. Patrick writes, "I testify in truth and in great joy of heart before God and his holy angels that I never had any other reason for returning to that nation ... except the Gospel and God's promises."

Two things stand out for me about St. Patrick. 1) That he was obedient to allow God to use him for the very people who had derailed his young life. 2) That God's love and forgiveness for him, helped to him to love and forgive others. God will do that for us too.
