Pastor's Letter

I'll be seventy-two years old on March 5th. While not exactly ancient, I'm no spring chicken either. I'm reminded of Psalm 90 which has some reflections on the human condition. Whereas God our Creator is outside time --"...from everlasting to everlasting you are God;" "... a thousand years in your sight are like a day that has gone by or like a watch in the night," -we humans are mortal. "You turn men back to dust saying, 'Return to dust, O sons of men'." "You sweep men away in the sleep of death; they are like the new grass of the morning -though in the morning it springs up new, by the evening it is dry and withered." Our mortality is a stark fact of our existence but so is our sinfulness. God's just indignation and wrath are terrifying. We cannot keep our secret sins from being exposed to God's eyes. "All our days pass away under your wrath; we finish our years with a moan."

The gloomy prospect before the Psalmist continues with this: "The length of our days is seventy years -- or eighty if we have the strength; yet their span is but trouble and sorrow, for they quickly pass, and we fly away."



But these stark facts are not all the Psalmist reflects upon. God can be our "dwelling place" and we may come in supplication for mercy and compassion. Relief is available because of "Your unfailing love." So the Psalmist prays, "May the favor of the Lord our God rest upon us." We yet may be glad and sing for joy because God's love will see us through. There is hope in the midst of the harsh realities we must endure. The Psalmist prays to the Lord, "Teach us to number our days aright, that we may gain a heart of wisdom." That's my prayer too. I hope you will also make it yours, however old you may be.

Letter from Pastor John Cross ... in honor of his friend, Pastor Jeff Stoopes and his birthday March 5th!

First of all, I want to thank all of the good people at the Pondera Valley & Golden West Lutheran Churches for your warm hospitality during my visit there in mid-January! It was a thrill for me to see how you are thriving and making plans for your future. Thank you for all of that!

Most important, I want to share a few thoughts about my friend Pastor Jeff Stoopes, who is now your part-time Term Pastor for the next two or three years. I have been in and around the Lutheran Church all of my life, and there is something special about a good match between pastor and congregation. You have that there at Pondera Valley & Golden West Lutheran Churches! I am not telling you anything that you do not know!

I was sorry I was not able to be a part of the installation of Pastor Stoopes back in November, but I was pleased to know what a festive and deeply spiritual experience that was. Since I could not be there, I want to say just a few things about Pastor Stoopes. Of course, he has been my friend since 1974, just before our rather legendary 8,334-mile bicycle adventure from the national convention of the American Lutheran Church in Detroit, Michigan to La Paz, Bolivia.

Since then, we have shared many other travels together and have maintained our friendship. Pastor Jeff really helped me as I became the part-time pastor at Selbu Lutheran Church (LCMC) here in LaCrosse, Washington. He was my official "pastoral coach," as I had never served a rural congregation before. My intent was only to stay a few months as an interim, but almost 11 years later, here I am! And the church is thriving!

We called Pastor Jeff our "Bishop for the Day" back in July, 2012 when he installed me as Pastor here at Selbu. Since then, Pastor Stoopes has stopped by here multiple times on his way to see family in Oregon, and has preached at least 15 - 20 times. I asked some of the members here to share a few thoughts about Pastor Jeff, and I want to share them with you folks:

- Cowboy Jeff is "one of us." Although he is only here a couple times a year, he always joins in whole-heartedly at church and also attends community events. Everyone loves him!
- Pastor Jeff's sermons are pretty deep, and sometimes I have to stop and listen very carefully. He is very much Christ-centered, I always am blessed by listening to his message.
- Pastor Jeff is a little different. On one hand he seems quiet and solemn, but, really, he has a super dry sense of humor and loves to make us laugh and join in with us!
- We were really excited to meet Grace Stoopes, as she joined Pastor Jeff on occasion! They both are spiritual and kind people – and a lot of fun!
- Some of us were not totally positive that Pastor John's "supposed" crazy bicycle trip to South America really happened! Ha! After watching Jeff and John together, and listening to some of their tales, that confirmed everything. They're both a little zany – in a good way!
- Pastor Stoopes is very spiritual, and quite deep! Sometimes I need to hear the sermon a second time, so I watch online. I like how he starts with a story and gets us laughing. Then he hits us with a very powerful message from the Gospel.
- Pastor Jeff's friendship with Pastor John brought our minister to us and his help along the way has inspired our pastor to do an even better job. Thanks be to God!

- When I heard he had received a short-term call in the Conrad, Montana area, I was so delighted for the congregations involved! We are sure that he fits hand-in-glove and he certainly must blend in with the rural culture up there in beautiful Montana.

Those are just a few of the comments that I wanted to share with you. Blessings all the way around, and thank each one of you for your continued support for the future of the PV and Golden West parishes. I know that Pastor Jeff has some definite plans during his tenure there, and I would urge you to cooperate as much as is possible. I know he has your best interest in mind and, more important, he will follow the Lord's lead on encouraging you to continue to reach more people for Christ in the greater Conrad area.
