Pastor's Letter


After a long winter (which dumped snow on us at Easter) we are longing for spring to come along at last. Oh for refreshing green to overcome the sere and somber palate of our hibernating northern plains environment!


Of all the turns of the seasons, spring is perhaps the most welcome and looked for. It has certainly inspired poets down through the ages, not least during the Romantic period in English literature. We might wander lonely as a cloud on a spring day like William Wordsworth and have our hearts uplifted to dance with the daffodils. Wordsworth's poem "I Wandered

Lonely as a Cloud" is a famous lyric poem inspired by a walk he took with his sister Dorothy in 1802. Walking through a forest they came upon a "long belt" of daffodils by a lake. The "crowd" of daffodils in the poem were "tossing their heads" and engaged in "sprightly dance." Some readers discern an allusion to the angelic host in this poem. If reading the poem inspires you to go out and dance with your daffodils your neighbors may think you odd -- but I wholeheartedly approve.

Jesus observed that the lilies of the field out-shown the splendor of Solomon's royal apparel (Matthew 6:28-29). If God cared enough to clothe mere ephemeral flowers so richly, we should, Jesus asserted, trust ourselves into our Creator's care for all our daily needs. God help so to do.

6 Biblical Truths When in Transition

1.God will be with this church at all times.

You are not forsaken. God is with our congregation. "I will never leave you or forsake you," (Heb 13:5). Pastors will come and go. Only God will never leave us. And the presence of God is more vital to the life of the church.

2. God is in control.

God "works all things according to the counsel of His will" (Eph. 1:11). Do you believe that? This pastoral transition is not happening outside of the will of God. God is working this according to the counsel of his will. So the question is not, "Who is in control?" God is in control. The question is, "Will you rest in him by trusting him?"

3. God plans good out of this transition.

It might not feel good right now, but God has promised that he works all things together for the good of his people (Rom 8:28). Is your church part of his people? If so, this transition is included in "all things"? Therefore, you can rest assured that good will come from it. That's how awesome God is: even those things that don't feel good are used for good. It might not be the good you have in mind, but it is good. Therefore, walk forward in faith.

4. It's okay to weep.

While good will come out this pastoral transition, that doesn't remove the deep sadness. Losing your pastor hurts. I'm reminded of how the Ephesian elders wept at Paul's goodbye: "And when he had said these things, he knelt down and prayed with them all. And there was much weeping on the part of all; they embraced Paul and kissed him, being sorrowful most of all because of the word he had spoken, that they would not see his face again. And they accompanied him to the ship" (Acts 20:36-38). I believe the Ephesians knew that God would be with them, that he was in control, and that he was going to bring good out of this transition. Nevertheless, they wept. And it's okay to weep. It's actually a way of saying thank you to both God and your pastor.

5. Ministry must go on.

Notice what the Great Commission does not say, "Go therefore and make disciples . . . if you have a pastor." One church that I used to work with lost their pastor. When I'd call their lay leaders about a ministry opportunity, their answer was always, "Well, you see, we just don't have a pastor right now." They had forgotten that ministry must continue in the interim. The Great Commission doesn't include any conditionals. Does ministry become a bit harder without a pastor leading? Probably so, but if he was a good pastor, he will have obeyed Ephesians 4:11-12 by equipping the saints for the work of the ministry. In the interim, you and the lay leadership of the church must make sure ministry continues. Get to work!

6. The church must not scatter.

Jesus promised the flock would scatter at his crucifixion (Mat 26:31). For a season, that's exactly what happened. The same often happens in churches during pastoral transition. Because "their" pastor is no longer there or ministry begins to lag, folks trickle out. Some reasons for going might be legitimate, but this may also be the time in which the congregation should most strongly gather together for support and encouragement. Recognize the temptation to scatter and work more diligently to stay bound together in unity and love.

This will be a season of testing for us and yes, I know you didn't ask for it, but with God's help, you'll endure it. For our church currently in this situation: let's make the interim bring blessings we never expected, and pray that God provides a new pastor for our church soon.

The next PV Council meeting will be Tues., May 10th at 6:30 p.m. in the Fellowship Hall.






History of Memorial Day

More than 150 years ago, Memorial Day took shape amid the backdrop of the U.S. Civil War. Before it ended, women began decorating the graves of fallen soldiers. In 1868, when May 30 was designated as Decoration Day, loved ones placed flowers on the graves of Union and Confederate soldiers alike.

By 1882, Decoration Day became known as Memorial Day, and soldiers who died in other wars were honored too. Over time, it became a day to remember all loved ones who have died — in war and otherwise. In 1971, Congress declared Memorial Day a national holiday to be observed on the last Monday in May. On Memorial Day, we pause to remember people who made the ultimate sacrifice for their country and for our freedom. We also pray for those who continue serving, especially those in harm's way.


