Pastor's Letter

As I write this Pastor's Letter I'm looking ahead to plans for various outdoors adventures from now until the snow flies again here in Montana. I've been an outdoorsman since circa 1957. That's when my father rigged up the top section of a two-piece bait casting rod with a piece of monofilament and tied on a brown & white woolly worm wet fly to fish the Long Tom River. The stream flowed at the edge of the cow pasture on the Warthen Road property my parents were then renting in the Star Valley, a few miles north of Noti, Oregon. Being the oldest kid of five, my father was eager to have his first born son follow him into the art of fly fishing. Which helps explain why I'm a very avid fly fisher and why I recently acquired an Adipose Flow drift boat. My obsession for fly fishing comes naturally -- I caught the bug from my dad.

As parents we set an example for our children. Kids understand the world from the point of view of growing up in a particular family in a particular place and culture. That is why the ancient Jewish people were keen on bringing up their children in the knowledge of God and God's law. "Train a child in the way he should go and when he is old he will not depart from it. (Proverbs 22:6)." "These commandments that I give you today are to be upon your hearts. Impress them on your children. Talk to them when you sit at home and when you walk along the road, when you lie down and when you get up." (Deuteronomy 6:6-7)

In Mark 10:13-16 we read about Jesus extending his love and care to children: "People were bringing little children to Jesus to have him touch them, but the disciples rebuked them. When Jesus saw this he was indignant. He said to them "let the little children come to me, and do not hinder them, for the kingdom of God belongs to such as these. I tell you the truth, anyone who will not receive the kingdom of God like a little child will never enter it. And he took the children in his arms, put his hands on them and blessed them."

As Christian parents we are admonished to bring our children up in the faith, to bring them to Jesus, to allow Jesus to touch and bless them. It begins with baptism but never ends there. Like the ancient people of God we live out our faith in all our family doings every day of the week. Only then does Jesus become a real presence in the lives of our children.

What you need:

- White paper
- Cup
- Scissors
- Pencil and markers
- Plastic drinking straw
 Glue



What you do:

- Using the cup's circular shape, trace two identical circles on the paper. Carefully cut them out.
- 2. In pencil, draw a person's head on one circle. Then place the blank circle on top and use the image beneath to guide you in drawing a flame above the head.
- 3. Color the two images with markers.
- 4. Apply glue to the backs of the circles and sandwich the top of the straw between them so it looks like a lollipop. Let dry.
- 5. Roll the straw quickly between your hands to view a mini motion picture.
