





“Giving God Our Best”

You may have heard me mention on Sunday something about a competition between two teams. Those native to the state know a lot more about this than I do. On November 23rd, the Bobcats and Grizzlies play for the Great Divide Trophy, introduced in 2001. Since this, Cat/Griz or is it Griz/Cat, rivalry first began on Nov. 26th, 1897 the Grizzlies lead 73-40-5.

Simply, what this has to do with you and me is our stewardship theme this year focuses on teams and coaching. The idea our stewardship committee came up with was to join in practicing first by giving. We saw the initial act of caring for what we were given was to give back. This is done in coaching and can be seen throughout all types of teams. Benevolence begins with a source. Good things happen because someone sets it in motion. Stewardship and care over others with all of creation takes work, and it is what we have been called to.

Everyday our prayer for daily bread is answered, yet there are people in our community and around the world who are hungry. This is our call. 
Yet, while this contest occurs we will also be talking about the stewardship of our church and what it takes to keep a place like this up and running. There will be more on that topic Sunday mornings though. Both require belief that drives not just a single person forward but the whole assembly together. We will need patience as we teach one another what the church is and why we meet together in this building. You will be asked to explore the idea of giving what you have for the succession of the coming generations. All of us need to pray how we might work as one just as Jesus interceded.

In closing there is one picture I ask that you consider. Imagine a map of Conrad. Locate the church here on 6th and Delaware. Do you have that image in your head? Now, think about the church in all the truth we know it to be. Move where you are looking to where all our members live. Highlight where all of us live, then think *does the church ever stop being what it is?*

Remember this body is made up of you and me with Jesus in the lead. Those in Christ know and have heard the call to love their neighbor. So what would that map look like if you imagined the church going out not just from one building but every place we live to the person right next to us. If you do not know how to minister or give to a person in any moment, I ask you to consider what you yourself have been given already. Then, give all that you have to whoever is in front of you or living across the street.

God from the very beginning gave this whole world to us. Now we are promised even more. The Kingdom is coming and we are heirs of it. Knowing this should change our entire perspective on stewardship. Giving in a simple competition between two football teams screams how good God has been to all of us. We have the freedom to give our excess to those in need. Dream about if we considered giving our first fruits or all we have instead of making a budget. Take a look at the blue sheet we included with the newsletter. In the end, remember God sent his Son for us, and desires mercy, not sacrifice. God does not need our good works, but our neighbors do. Who are you being called to? Please bring your offerings to the church at your convenience. Our goal as a congregation is to use your gifts to benefit our local community and whole world. Join us as we go out with our two copper coins. Peace be with you.






The next Golden West Council meeting will be a Joint Council Meeting at Golden West, Tuesday, November 19th at 6 p.m.



CHANGE YOUR SPOT...

In the Old Testament, Jeremiah becomes so disgusted with his people's unfaithfulness and idolatry that he almost believes they can't change. He wonders whether a leopard can change its spots. When a Sunday school teacher posed that question, one student pondered before replying, "Yes ... If he doesn't like the spot he's in, he can change it." Jeremiah reached a similar conclusion: His people could change their evil ways — their "spots" — if they chose to. "You can do good who are accustomed to do evil," he says (Jeremiah 13:23, NRSV). As another prophet later notes, God has shown us "what is good ... To act justly and to love mercy and to walk humbly with your God" (Micah 6:8, NIV). What spot — or spots — can you change?
