### Pastor's Letter

In the last chapter of *Knowing God*, "The Adequacy of God", J.I. Packer wrote, "Paul's letter to Rome is the peak of Scripture, however you look at it. Luther called it the 'clearest gospel of all.' ... All roads in the Bible lead to Romans, and all views afforded by the Bible are seen most clearly from Romans, and when the message of Romans gets into a [person's] heart there is no telling what may happen." But first the text has to get into one's head.

I took a technical exegetical course on Romans at Fuller Theological Seminary back in the early 90's in which we engaged in a very close study of the text -- in the original Greek. It made my head hurt. It was a FOUR EXCEDRIN class period twice a week for ten weeks. Well, be assured dear reader, that this Pastor's Letter will not give you a tension headache. However ... I do want to 'rattle your cage' a bit. That is, I want to shake you -- gently -- to get your attention. Fair enough? Here goes... When was the last time you read Paul's letter to the Romans in one sitting, in one go, beginning to end, alpha to omega, first sentence to last? Silence. Okay, -- may I gently encourage you to do so -- this month, or next month, or next year? I'm now officially on record of so encouraging you, dear readers.


Paul's letters were written with the understanding that they would be read straight

through, in one sitting, by someone who could read and speak clearly, to the whole assembled group of Christians in the house fellowships that made up the 'parish' or 'churches' of the city or province to which they were addressed. Then they were copied and recopied and sent all over the Mediterranean world to Christians who may or may not have seen or even heard of Paul the Apostle. That historical fact is why we have Paul's words to the First Century Roman Christians today -- that and the providential activity of our Creator.

The late James Innell Packer was an English Anglican cleric, theologian, and professor. His many books have been a very real blessing to many thousands of Christians all over the world. *Knowing God* is certainly worth reading. It is a significant exposition of the biblical understanding of how and why we must know God, our Creator.

Reading Romans, I suggest, is *required* reading for every Christian. *Knowing God* is *recommended* reading. That book shouldn't be read cover to cover in one sitting -- it wasn't intended to be read that way. A little bit every day for a month would be just enough to fill mind and heart with a clearer vision of the God we were made to know and love.

### FROM SCARCITY TO ABUNDANCE

Author Parker Palmer recounted being stuck on a storm-grounded airplane for hours. Though it was lunchtime, meals weren't available, and passengers grew irritable. One flight attendant apologized for the delay, expressing empathy for people's stress, and then passed around two breadbaskets, asking everyone to contribute something.

"Some of you brought snacks to tide you over, and some of you have a few LifeSavers or chewing gum," she said. "And if you don't have anything edible, you have a picture of your children or spouse ... or a bookmark or a business card." Then, she said, "we'll pass the baskets around again, and everyone can take out what they need."

Complaints soon ceased, Palmer recalled, as passengers searched for items and stopped focusing

on themselves. The plane became a community of sharing as scarcity and deprivation transformed into abundance and joy.

On Oct. 11th the Pondera

Valley Council met. There will be a Mental Health walk on Conrad's walking path October 27th. We were contacted by Christian counselor Steve Baliko in case we wanted to provide something for the walkers. Susan Gustafson suggested Bible markers and she will take care of getting them. Thanks Susan! The council voted on the recommendation by the Call Committee to bring to the congregations on October 30, 2022 a vote on extending a Conditional Term Call to Pastor Jeffrey A. Stoopes until December 31, 2025 as our part-time pastor. If the Call Committee finds a suitable candidate before

then, as the pastor, and a call is extended and accepted, Pastor Stoopes will resign at an appropriate time. This has been agreed to by Pastor Stoopes. It pass unanimously! Hence the council also voted to pass forward the Letter of Call and definition of compensation, benefits and responsibilities of the pastor that the congregations will be voting on. The letter to go out to the members was also discussed and voted to accept. It will be mailed on Oct. 17th. If the congregations vote to call Pastor Jeff, it is hoped that sometime in November there can be a Joint Worship and Installation with a parish potluck to follow.

The next PV Council meeting will be a JOINT Council as well on Tuesday, November 1st at 6 p.m. at Golden West.

Christ the King Sunday is November 20th.




