

"Confirmation Everyday"

Soon several students will be asked to share their faith on Sunday with our congregation. The task is sharing what they believe publically. We want them to tell us who Jesus is. Specifically, what has Jesus done for them? How? And who has he given His blessings through today and now?

Imagine being in that situation yourself. Romans 10:8-11, "But what does it say? 'The word is near you, in your mouth and in your heart' (that is, the word of faith we proclaim); because, if you confess with your mouth that Jesus is Lord and believe in your heart that God raised him from the dead, you will be saved. For with the heart one believes and is justified and with the mouth one confesses and is saved. For the Scripture says, "Everyone who believes in him will not be put to shame."

Really the question is the same that Jesus asked the disciples in the New Testament when he said to them, "Who do you say I am?" Reflecting on their answers we are able to learn a lot. Sometimes they gave the right response when asked directly, but when faced with the crucifixion quickly flip-flopped. They knew who Jesus is yet when asked about following him denied involvement and ran. Throughout our lives Jesus will keep calling and asking us to answer these same questions. Confirmation and sharing your faith statement cannot be a onetime event because at any point in your life someone may ask who you put your faith in. In those moments we are given the opportunity to give the hope we have to someone else.

Consider, when was the last time you told someone that they were forgiven for the sake of Jesus? When do you find yourself speaking God's name? James 5:20 reminds us, "My brothers, if anyone among you wanders from the truth and someone brings him back, let him know that whoever brings back a sinner from his wandering will save his soul from death and cover a multitude of sins." What would you say if you were asked to stand in

front your loved ones and confess what you hold in your heart considering that? Confirmation Sunday is an important rite because we are sending our youth out with the confidence that Jesus is with them where ever they may find themselves but we should not exclude ourselves. The Church is to stand behind every believer with prayer because the reality is that they will go through what we and the disciples have. Life will bring them to their knees as perhaps it has done to many of us more than once.

This all points to the Great Commission that sends us and the Holy Priesthood we are a part of. It is not limited to the building or one Sunday of our lives. This is an everyday rite which we have the freedom to bless all those who might hear it. Stating our faith publically and in the presence of others has effect on lives even if we do not immediately see results. Everyday each of us needs to be reminded of God's mercies the moment we wake up. It is our nature to forget and neglect what the Word says so we are called to repeat it to each other again and again, especially to those closest to us.

This is not an obligation but rather a gift, one to us and those we spend our days with. When equipped with the Word your heart will be full of truth that lets you speak in love to those around you. Then are we able to do a good work because we are sharing the joy and confidence we have in our salvation so that others may too. It lets other believers know they are not alone, especially when facing dark places, doubt, and despair. Jesus says "do not fear" and we are instantly given courage. Where there is guilt and shame our Lord washes away with forgiveness and grace. Even the greatest questions of life are answered by the Way, Truth, and Life. Who am I? Why am I here? In Scripture we hear each person is made in God's image and that every life is valuable.

What we believe is no mere checklist. It is the Living Word that does what it says. Each person has it written on their hearts and the Holy Spirit gives us faith to believe each letter

is for us. Confessing the name of Jesus saves and gives blessing in the present tense to both the speaker and listener. Each of those gifts is not abstract. Love, forgiveness, and courage can be felt changing lives drastically fast or requiring tedious patience.

Children are easy to teach but as we get older we get more resistant to hearing in general. Speaking in front of people is listed as a top phobia. This is to say that proclamation is not easy and may only get harder as we progress. Consider our culture, the world, and most concerning the household. Do you hear the name of Jesus? And how is it being used? Who needs to hear it most? I ask you try to not only write a faith statement like this but that you also find the person who needs to hear and share it gently with truth and Spirit. Confirmation Sunday is practice for what soon will be arriving for our students and we can testify through witness. So, I pray as a part of the church standing behind the soon to be confirmed that we might proclaim our faith bravely in our daily lives again. Produce every fruit of the Spirit in us so we may give all the Jesus gracefully. Let blessings of generations hear about who Jesus is from our hearts and mouths clearly, for God the Father's glory, amen.




Pondera Valley Council met Sept. 13th. Education reported that new material will be ordered once they know the numbers they


