Pastor's Letter

God is love (1 John 4:16), God is eternal (1 Timothy 1:17), therefore love is eternal. That is simple logic. But the reality of that assertion is a great mystery and its depth is unfathomable. All the great Christian theologians have weighed in on this topic and many have said or written helpful things. None has exhausted the profundity of the idea. As you and I try to understand God's self-revelation, recorded in scriptures, we will be often overwhelmed. It's all too much for our meager minds to comprehend. But that does not make it any less real in an objective sense. So we press on to know our Creator as best we can under the circumstances.

The Christian church, from its inception, has preached the gospel as the good news of our loving Creator coming to us in the person of Jesus Christ to save us lost sinners. It is encapsulated in a straightforward text -John 3:16 - which states: "For God so loved the world that He gave His one and only Son, that whoever believes in Him shall not perish but have eternal life."

Love here means self-giving for the real good of others at a cost to oneself. It is not a mere emotion, it is not a thing that can change or be corrupted, it is eternal -timeless -- beyond the limits of the created order. Divine love is thus beyond creaturely powers. Humans can only love, St. John

asserted, "Because He (God) first loved us" (1 John 4:19). All our natural "loves" are mere after effects of God's endowment of human nature for fellowship with other creatures. That endowment has been severely degraded by our sinful rebellion against God. All our natural loves are tainted by self-interest.

C.S. Lewis tried to explain all this in his seminal work The Four Loves. At 180 pages it's not very long - but I have found it very helpful in understanding how natural and divine love differs and relates to each other. I highly recommend the book to all adult readers. In the final chapter, "Charity", Lewis writes, "To love at all is to be vulnerable. Love anything, and your heart will certainly be wrung and possibly be broken." That is the sad reality we must all face in old creation.

But God, the Creator of new creation, is that ultimate reality from which love comes to transform us even now in our often painful journey in old creation. It is God's love that makes everything new. God can awake in us a love toward Himself, a supernatural appreciative love, that is the true center of our existence. All lesser loves are transformed by this one. It is an experience we can only have by grace. May God grant that grace to us all.





About the role of obedience in prayer, Elliot asks, "Does it make sense to pray for guidance about the future if we are not obeying in the thing that lies before us today? How many momentous events in Scripture depended on one person's seemingly small act of obedience! Rest assured: Do

what God tells you to do now, and, depend upon it, you will be shown what to do next."





MISSIONARY-MINDED PRAYER

An important part of missions is prayerfully supporting the church. Use this activity to guide your family's prayer time.

What you need:

- Plastic bag (large zippered)
- · Permanent marker
- Bandage
- Toy plane
- Heart-shaped drawing or toy
- Spoon
- Coin
- Hot-sauce packet

What you do:

- 1. Label the bag with details about the missionaries you'll be praying for (names, location, specific needs).
- 2. Add small prayer-prompt objects to guide your prayer time (bandage = health, plane = travel, heart = relationships, spoon = cultural connection, coin = finances, hot sauce = boldness).
- 3. Include other objects that will prompt prayer for missionaries' specific needs.
- 4. Place the bag where it will remind your family to pray regularly.


