

From the Pastor

"Time flies when you're havin' fun!" That's a happy saying that any of us might have said in the past. I hope it's a sentiment that still holds true for all of us. But time flies in any case -- whether it's good times or bad. The human condition of experiencing the shortness of human life compared with other living things, or the age of the universe, is something the ancients were aware of and made note of often enough. The phrase "time flies" in Latin is tempus fugit. You may have seen it on cast metal sundials. The expression comes from line 284 of book 3 of Virgil's Georgio's where it appears as fugit irreparable tempus: "it escapes, irretrievable time". And, like any aphorism, this one gets rebuttals from rebuttalists, like Henry Austin Dobson (1840-1921), who rebutted thusly: "Ah, no! Alas, time stays, we go." It is we who fly away ... is it not? That's what we sing about when we sing Albert E. Brumley's song "I'll Fly Away" written on 1929. He later said, "Actually, I was dreaming of flying away from that cotton field when I wrote 'I'll Fly Away'." That was not an uncommon thing in the minds of depression era rural farm laborers ... especially in the south. The song was published in 1932. It was spread by travelling southern gospel quartets and aired over the radio all over the United States. It was a statement of hope in the midst of very tough times. "Some glad morning when this life is o'er, I'll fly away; to a home on God's celestial shore, I'll fly away." Often sung at funerals, it gives voice to the Christian hope of entering God's new creation.

In my own reflections about my ministry here as your pastor, I can happily say, "Time flies when you're havin' fun." It is a joy to serve among you. But my three year term call means that, at some point, "I'll fly away". Of course, being a mortal, I could at any moment be called away out of this life into the choir immortal. Assuming God has a bunch more things for me to do -- which might take years or decades to accomplish --I could move from the category "old" to "ancient" (80's) to "pre-historic" (over 90) before I fly away to "God's celestial shore." Be that as it may, I'm convinced that my days of pastoring are coming to a close. I'll always consider myself still "on the bench" ready to be called in for one play -- pulpit supply. But my memory, energy, and stamina are all fading with age. Creeping decrepitude is dogging my steps. My recent bout with Covid-19 reminded me that I don't bounce back from illness like I used to.

The admonition that comes to my mind in my present state is St. Paul's recorded in Ephesians 5:15-16 "Be very careful, then, how you live -- not as unwise but as wise, make the most of every opportunity, because the days are evil." I ask for your prayers as I complete my term call either before or on December 31, 2025.

"Now to Him who is able to do immeasurably more than all we ask or imagine, according to His power that is at work in us, to Him be glory in the church and in Christ Jesus throughout all generations, for ever and ever! Amen" (Ephesians 3:20-21). Pastor Jeff Stoopes



What helps you sort out what you're feeling, or experience an emotion more deeply? What allows you to let loose and cry, or fully celebrate when you're joyful? Nature helps some of us get in touch with our feelings, perhaps because it removes us from screens and other distractions.


But when getting out isn't possible — no mountain lake is nearby, or the weather isn't tranquil — consider the gift of music. Often instrumental or vocal music helps us access the depths of our soul like nothing else can. God may even speak to us through music — whether in song lyrics, our own inner thoughts or wordless stirrings of the heart.

Albert Schweitzer, a pastor, musicologist, physician and more, said, "Joy, sorrow, tears, lamentation, laughter — to all these music gives voice, but in such a way that we are transported from the world of unrest to a world of peace, and see reality in a new way, as if we were sitting by a



mountain lake and contemplating hills and woods and clouds in the tranquil and fathomless water."

Make some playlists for various emotions: joy, grief, anxiety, hope. Then imagine yourself relaxing in nature, and experience God's love.

Here are some of the prayer requests:


- 1)Continue to pray for adjustment and getting settled in as we are serving here in Laos.


