From the Pastor

As you read this, Lord willing, I'll be on vacation. I'm taking a month off to drive my Jeep from Montana to the east coast. I'm billing this as "My Last Paid Vacation." Which is sort of catchy and would make a great book title. As a matter of fact, I'm thinking of self-publishing a book with that as the title - My Last Paid Vacation: Montana to Maryland and Back Again.

But first I have SIX sermons to write and this article to finish. I'm hoping my brain and right hand are up to the strain. I'm a bit stressed and pressed for time to get all my ducks in a row before heading east on Easter Sunday. We all get pressed for time sometimes to get all our work done, don't we?

Our Creator is never pressed for time or stressed out. Is there anything too hard for God to cope with? Not according to the Bible. Consider these passages:

Genesis 18:14 "Is anything too hard for the LORD?" That's the Lord's question to Abraham and Sarah about the promise of Sarah having a son when it seemed impossible.

Jeremiah 32:17 "Ah, Sovereign Lord, You have made the heavens and the earth by your great power and outstretched arm. **Nothing is too hard for you.**"

Luke 1:35-37 In this passage, the angel answered Mary's question "How will this be?" Mary is a virgin and can't have a baby on her own. "The Holy Spirit will come upon you, the angel said, and the power of the Most High will overshadow you. So the Holy One to be born will be called the Son of God. Even Elizabeth your relative is going to have a child in her old age and she who was said to be barren is in her

sixth month. For nothing is impossible with God."

Mark 10:24-27 Jesus said, "Children, how hard it is to enter the kingdom of God! It is easier for a camel to go through the eye of a needle than for a rich man to enter the kingdom of God." The disciples were even more amazed, and said to each other, "Who then can be saved?" NEW PARSONAGE

A special PVLC congregational meeting was held on April 14, 2024 following the worship service. By majority vote the congregation authorized the PVLC Council to purchase a new parsonage, gave them the authority to secure a loan for the purchase of said parsonage and the authority to sell the existing parsonage, called the Montgomery house. Pastor Stoopes will be leaving his position of Pastor of PVLC at the end of 2025 and therefore the Call Committee is actively pursuing candidates for his position. In preparation, the Council has been watching for the availability of a suitable house. Recently, it was made known to the PVLC Council that the home of Roman Ketterling and the late Judy

Ketterling, PVLC long time members, was available for purchase. Council members viewed the house by invitation of Karla Breding, their daughter



who is also a member. Karla graciously availed herself for multiple showings of the home and answered all questions regarding the house and lot which were posed to her by Council members. Impressed with the property and satisfied with the favorable terms of purchase, the Council voted at its April 7, 2025 meeting to purchase the Ketterling home for a new parsonage. A committee which included PVLC Treasurer, Lyn Carlson, was established to work through the details of said purchase.

Make these sweet sandwiches for a Mother's Day tea party.

What you need:

- 4 oz. cream cheese, softened
- 1 cup heavy cream
- 3 Tablespoons powdered sugar
- 1 teaspoon lemon juice
- 6-10 strawberries, washed and sliced
- 6 slices of white bread
- Cellophane
- Adult help



What you do:

- 1. With an electric mixer, whip the cream cheese in a bowl until fluffy.
- Add cream, powdered sugar, and lemon juice. Continue whipping on high speed until mixture is stiff.
- On each slice of bread, spread a layer of the mixture. Then arrange some sliced strawberries on top.
- Place the sandwiches together, with filling on the inside.
- Wrap tightly in cellophane. Chill for two hours so the filling sets.
- Trim off crusts with a serrated knife.
 Cut sandwiches in squares or triangles.

Fathers do amazing things for their families, but the greatest gift our dads can share with us is their faith in God.


