From the Pastor

I grew up on the cartoon strip Peanuts and of course the Christmas Special where Pig Pen pledges, "In spite of my outward appearance, I shall try to run a neat inn," while Frieda who has been assigned the role of the innkeeper's wife complains that the cloud of dust that follows him is ruining the curl of her naturally curly hair. When I grew older and became a serious student of the Bible I learned that most of that depiction of the nativity was misunderstood. There wasn't an inn with a no vacancy sign out front. Jesus most likely was born in the home of a relative at Bethlehem. There was no room in the upper room, a room in a typical home used to house guests. It is the same type of upper room where Jesus ate his last supper with his disciples and the same type of upper room where the disciples gathered on Pentecost. The upper room of the nativity would have been filled with relatives due to the census, and poor Mary had the choice of giving birth in the middle of a family reunion or going to the more private downstairs of the house where the animals were stabled. The mangers were actually part of the structure of the home. Animals and people all slept under the same roof. Downstairs Mary could deliver her child, most likely with the women of the house attending her, away from the eyes of the men. Jesus would have been swaddled and, yes, laid in the manger as his crib.

This much more ordinary birth means Jesus was born in a place bustling with relatives celebrating their coming together as family again. And while my Christmas-card picture of two lonely, homeless parents may be challenged by this scholarship, one thing I am certain that Peanuts got right is that Uncle Pig Pen and Aunt Frieda were there. Pig Pen's sins follow him

around in a cloud. He could easily confess that he is by nature unclean, but when told he is an absolute mess and handed a mirror, the old sinner in him protests that to the contrary he didn't think he looked that good! How like all of us when the mirror is held up to us and our sins. We compare ourselves to others or to earlier versions of ourselves. I could be so much worse. Meanwhile the poor Friedas in our lives have to live with our sins. They lose the curl of their naturally curly hair. They experience the frustration of calling the sinner to repentance, of holding up the mirror even, and still having the sinner insist things have never been better. Frieda's sins of vanity and judgementalism are called into question by Charlie Brown who tries to get her to put the best construction on Pig Pen's state, "Don't think of it as dust. Think of it as maybe the soil of some great past civilization. Maybe the soil of ancient Babylon."

The upper room of the nativity was filled with Uncle Pig Pens and Aunt Friedas all caught up in their sins. With the holidays upon us, many of you will have full upper rooms or will fill your relative's upper rooms. And you will all bring your sins with you. It's going to be crowded. Enjoy the food, avoid the silly divisive conversations, share the laughs and the sorrows. No matter how crowded it gets, God will find space, even if it is the smallest empty manger in a house full of sinners. God will fill that space with something miraculous, something all those sinners desperately need more than clean clothes or naturally curly hair—a Saviour who is Christ the Lord.

JOINT Council met on Nov. 10th at Pondera Valley. Pastor Jeff said he is excited about activities in both churches. He will make home visits

as required or needed. The councils decided to not have Thanksgiving or Christmas Day services. Christmas Eve services will be at 3 p.m. at Golden West and 5 p.m. at Pondera Valley. The radio (KSEN-AM) will broadcast at 7 p.m. The common budget items were discussed. The annual meeting dates were decided for PV on Jan. 25, 2026 and for GW Feb. 1, 2026. Start putting together your annual reports and email them to Kim Wiest!

PV Council met following Joint Council. Work on the wiring for sound and tvs is in progress. It was questioned whether we needed the tvs in the sanctuary but since they are already purchased they will be put in. Building and Ground concerns have been addressed. The Worship Committee met with Pastor and much was discussed. Communion at the rail (table) will be done unless there is a big crowd, such as Christmas Eve when it will be continuous.

People need to be reminded to fill in from the center and then around. The advent wreath will have a new place this year. It is being placed on (and in) the baptismal font. Should we have a baptism during Advent it will be moved to on the altar. Singing the Lord's Prayer and Aaron's blessing will be a normal part of worship on non-communion Sundays. Worship services will begin with 3 chimes. The parsonage walk-through with Pastor is complete. The budget 2026 reviewed recommendations made. 




The Angels' Song in Three Words

On the very first Christmas Eve, frightened shepherds were suddenly surrounded by light and music. A choir of angels filled the night sky, singing: "Glory to God in the highest, and on earth peace, good will toward men" (Luke 2:14, KJV).

Nineteenth-century pastor Charles Kingsley reflected on how those three simple words - glory, peace, and good will still capture the meaning of Jesus' birth and the hope it brings.

Glory. God's glory isn't shown in dazzling displays of power but in humility and mercy. The baby in the manger revealed God's greatness by stooping low, forgiving, and showing love.



Peace. True peace is more than the absence of conflict. It comes when we follow God's example of selflessness, giving up pride and selfish ambition to live in harmony with one another.

Good will. God's good will toward us is a gift that transforms our lives. Through Jesus, God invites us out of selfishness and sin into a life marked by love, kindness, and community.

The angels' song wasn't meant only for shepherds long ago. It still sings to us today, calling each of us to live in glory, peace, and good will.


