
News From Our Church Council

At their March meeting, Council began consideration of the following proposed updates to the current guidelines for in-person worship at Zion. Any changes would not be implemented until Easter Sunday, allowing time for members of our Zion family to provide their input and suggestions. Contact Council President Mike Harrass or any of our faithful Council members with your input.

DRAFT Ideas:

- Item 1 We will encourage worshipers to only do what they are comfortable with and will accommodate concerns as we are able.
- Item 2 For fully vaccinated worshipers, masks are not mandatory, although encouraged.
- Item 3 Social distancing will remain in place, i.e., seating will stay every-other row. We will be returning the red hymnals to the pews along with Booklets with Setting 4, and likely not photocopying hymns or complete worship service.

In other business, Council also approved in-person WELCA meetings.

Eastern Europe Crisis - Lutheran Disaster Response

How We at Zion Can Help Through the ELCA's LDR -

On Feb. 24, Russian forces invaded Ukraine, launching land, sea and air attacks. Millions of civilians fleeing the violence are heading toward Ukraine's western districts and to neighboring countries. According to one report of the UN High Commissioner for Refugees, 3 million people are seeking refuge in neighboring countries and over 1 million people are displaced within Ukraine. There are major humanitarian concerns for both internally displaced people and refugees. Many of these Ukrainians fleeing their homes need shelter and such basic necessities as food, water and toiletries. Care for people also includes pastoral and psychological support to address the trauma they've endured.

Lutheran Disaster Response is accompanying our companions in Ukraine, Hungary, Poland and Slovakia, as well as such ecumenical partners as Lutheran World Federation and Church World Service, in their humanitarian responses to the crisis. These partners provide refugees with immediate support and supplies such as food, blankets, water and hygiene kits. Presiding Bishop Elizabeth Eaton has joined other religious leaders from Europe and around the globe in issuing an interfaith call for peace in the region.

What we at Zion can do:

- Pray: Please pray for those in Ukraine, Russia, Poland and neighboring countries that have been affected by the crisis in Ukraine. May God's healing presence give them peace and hope in their time of need.
