Jail Ministry Update

It has been quite some time since I've updated you on the Women's Jail Ministry at the Lake County Jail. Unfortunately, that is because there hasn't been much to report since the volunteers are still not allowed into the facility. Each time jail administration considers allowing volunteers to return, another variant of the COVID-19 virus causes an uptick in cases at the jail and the plans are put on hold again. I continue to collect Christian books for the jail as I am sure that one day volunteers will be allowed back in. I will take the books in at that time.

In the meantime, Zion's involvement in jail ministry is having an impact in an unusual way. I recently received a phone call from our former member, Mary Greer, who is now living in Tampa. She wanted to get more detailed information on the use of Christian books at the jail to share with the women's group at her Tampa church. She had brought up the idea at the women's meeting and they were very interested in pursuing something similar in their area. We had a lengthy phone conversation, and I offered to answer any further questions the group might have as they proceed with this project. How wonderful that our involvement in the Lake County Jail Ministry could possibly be carried forward in Tampa!

Zion 's "Behind the Scenes" Outreach (Part 2)

A previous edition of the *Zion Connection* included Part 1 of information on two of Zion's vital but lesser-known outreach funds. (That article explaining the *Project Zion Fund* is reprinted on pg. 3 of this edition.) The second of these two "behind the scenes" designated funds through which Zion quietly provides help and support to members of our local community is the *Members Care Fund*.

The Members Care Fund was established to provide support to anyone (not limited to Zion members) having a difficult time meeting financial obligations. The fund is supported by members of Zion, who may designate funds thru weekly offerings or memorials. All financial assistance offered (usually in the form of gift cards) is completely confidential. The decision to offer financial assistance can only be made by the pastor. Likewise, the pastor alone determines the amount of need to be given in an amount not to exceed the balance of the fund. Pastoral support is offered along with the financial assistance.
