Annual Congregational Meeting 2023

NEW DATE: Sunday, February 12, 2023

The annual Congregational Meeting will be held February 12, 2023, immediately following the worship service. The meeting will be live-streamed <u>(Link)</u> for members who are not able to attend in person. At present, the agenda includes the following items:

- 1. Proposed amendments to the constitution, mandated by ELCA synodical action last year. Full details of the proposed amendments are attached to the email with which you received this ZC newsletter.
- 2. Election of Council: Two council positions for 3-year terms need to be filled, and congregational approval of Becky Wehman to continue for the two remaining years (she was selected by the council in early 2022 to fill a vacancy).
- 3. Approval of the 2023 Budget.

Copies of the proposed agenda items will be made available in midlate January. Annual reports about Zion's activities in 2022 will also be shared. Additional agenda items should be proposed to the Council no later than January 22, 2023.

Super Special Note: If there is interest, it has been proposed that the meeting be followed by a pot-luck lunch. All in favor say, "Yum!"

At the meeting on January 8, 2023, Council approved -

Annual Human Trafficking Awareness Month

Pray Without Ceasing - January 15th thru February 11th

Since 2005, Women of the ELCA (and men, too!) has been actively working to end human trafficking. Some work on education and awareness. Others provide support to agencies helping women to leave or who have left human trafficking. Others still are working to change laws that criminalize the victims of trafficking.

The 4 weeks prior to the annual NFL Super Bowl (2/12/23) have been designated as a time of prayer to end human trafficking, during which the people of the ELCA organization are called to engage in prayer. Daily prayers for use from Jan. 15 - Feb. 11, 2023, are <u>available here</u>.

To delve deeper, a guide entitled <u>"My Neighbor is Not for Sale"</u> has been prepared to bring congregations the facts, figures, and stories of the insidious world of sex trafficking of children and youth in our country. Education is the very first step in prevention efforts.
