Synod Assembly 2023 - Renewed in Christ

Friday, June 8th thru Sunday, June 10th in Orlando

Each year, Synod leaders, clergy, congregational leaders, and laity of the Florida-Bahamas Synod gather for a joy-filled time of worship, workshops, decision-making and fellowship. The theme of the **2023**Synod Assembly is "Renewed in Christ" based on Hebrews 13:6-8. This year's keynote speaker is **Bishop Patricia Ann Curtis Davenport**.

In alternating years, the 3-day agenda at Assembly either focuses more on workshop sessions and provides dozens of workshops covering all areas of congregational ministry, or the agenda focuses more on plenary (business of the church) sessions. 2023 is the year of mostly plenary sessions, and important business will be conducted by those attending as designated voting delegate(s) from each congregation.

Assembly 2023 will be held in Orlando from June 8-10, 2023. For us at Zion, commuting for 1 or more days is an easy option for those who prefer not to stay overnight. For more info, please talk with Pastor, one of our Zion Council members, or email the **church office**.

Rachel's Day Observance

Boldly Standing For Children - Sunday, May 7th @ Zion

Our Zion unit of Women of the ELCA is preparing a special Rachel's Day observance to be held at the beginning of worship on May 7th. Since 1995, Rachel's Day has been observed by Women of the ELCA annually on the first Sunday in May. The original focus of Rachel's Day was, and still is, shining a light on gun violence against children. The day takes its name from Jeremiah 31:15–17. In those verses, Rachel grieves for her children. Rachel's Day is a time set aside to mourn the loss of our children and to renounce the forces of violence and fear.

From <u>EducationWeek</u> Website: School shootings—terrifying to students, educators, parents, and communities—always reignite polarizing debates about gun rights and school safety. To bring context to these debates, <u>EducationWeek</u> journalists began tracking shootings on K-12 school property that resulted in firearm-related injuries or deaths.

There have been 14 school shootings to date this year (April 2023) that resulted in injuries or deaths. There were 51 school shootings with injuries or deaths last year, the most in a single year since *EducationWeek* began tracking such incidents in 2018. There were 35 in 2021, 10 in 2020, and 24 each in 2019 and 2018

<u>From WELCA Website</u>: Mass shootings are not the only exposure children have to gun violence, certainly. Violence is embedded into many a child's life. Twenty years ago the emphasis was the loss of inner city children to gang gun violence. Drugs, abuse, neglect, poor education, health and hunger also contributed to the death of children.

Today, children are also threatened with death by suicide, often a result of being bullied. Suicide is the third leading cause of death among young people, according to the United States Center for Disease Control. For every suicide among young people, there are at least 100 suicide attempts. More than 14 percent of high school students have considered suicide, and almost 7 percent have attempted it. Victims of bullying are between two to nine times more likely to consider suicide than non-victims, according to studies by Yale University.

Whether the threat is from a school shooter, from bullies, or any one of a myriad of other social ills, we need to understand - No group of children is safe until all children are safe.
