## **Ever-Changing, Ever-Faithful - Food Pantry News**

Last month, our local food pantry, long known to most of us as Faith Neighborhood Center, was proud to celebrate its 50th anniversary of serving those in need in South Lake County. The center was founded in 1972 by a group of seven loving, caring, bold women (two of whom were important to me as a child) meeting in a church basement at the First United Methodist Church of Clermont. The women's project started with sorting through the mountains of used clothing left over from their annual rummage sale so it could be given to neighbors in need. Once they realized, however, that food was an even more dire need, the women never looked back. Thanks be to God that as the need in South Lake County has continued to grow, so has the support of local individuals, churches (Zion!), schools, community groups and civic organizations.

As you may have heard, this vital ministry has recently changed its name from Faith Neighborhood Center to The Neighborhood Center of South Lake. What hasn't changed is the core mission of the center:

## (Changes at Food Pantry - cont.)

We are a group of individuals bound together by a commitment to assist our neighbors who are in need. Actually, the change in name is merely a reflection of the exciting new path upon which the center finds itself in 2022. This new path is thanks in great part to the truly bold, faith-filled, and professional leadership of its dynamic director, Trish Kry. I can say with certainty that Trish would certainly have fit right in with those seven founding women! Under Trish's leadership, the following two exciting changes have occurred recently.

- The hiring of a full-time case worker has enabled NCSL to greatly expand the scope of services it provides. The case worker works with individual clients to help them connect with and navigate all available resources to meet their needs: SNAP (food stamps) and Medicaid application assistance, medical assistance, job training, health and parenting education, housing support, utility payments, child care needs, income tax assistance, homeless programs, and many others.
- A huge step forward in ensuring that NCSL will be able to keep pace with the ever-growing need for services in South Lake occurred in February as The City Council of Groveland voted unanimously to approve the center's request for the City to donate property located adjacent to the Public Safety Complex. This property, in addition to significant financial support from <u>The Community Foundation of</u> <u>South Lake</u> and <u>United Way of Lake and</u> <u>Sumter</u>, has enabled the center to begin planning for a new building in which to house its greatly-expanded offerings.
