



Vocations



Agnes was just 12 years old when she was killed during the persecutions under Emperor Diocletian around the year 305. In the past her feast day was the occasion for the blessing of the lambs, whose wool was used by the nuns of St. Agnes in Rome to weave palliums (cloaks) for archbishops. Her attributes are the lamb and the martyr's branch of palm. She is the subject of universal devotion.
