

Third Sunday in Ordinary Time

Repent! The Kingdom of heaven is at hand!
Time is running out!

These are the messages in today's liturgy. How often do we, as sinners, put off going to confession, thinking we have time on our side? The truth is that we never know the day or the hour when our time here on earth may be coming to an end. The Point is to always be ready and willing to reconcile ourselves to God and to our fellows. But it is not simply enough to confess our sins. We must actively turn away from our sins and live changed lives. It is the interior change of heart that God seeks from us—he seeks complete conversion of manners. For this complete conversion to take place, we must not only say we're sorry—we have to "do" sorry.

In today's first reading, Jonah goes to Nineveh to warn the people to turn from their evil ways or face certain destruction. Initially, Jonah ignores God's call to warn the Nenevites and famously boards a ship to flee to Tarshish, only to be tossed overboard and swallowed by a big fish. When Jonah prays for deliverance, God hears his cry: the fish spews him onto the beach, and Jonah is saved from certain death. By the time of today's reading, Jonah has ears willing to listen, and he follows God's command. He goes to Nineveh to carry God's message.

To forgive others their sins, to show mercy toward others as our heavenly Father has shown us, we must remember that we are all sinners. We must have God's help. Jesus—God in the flesh—was without sin. He is the perfect model of forgiveness and mercy. Throughout his public ministry, he was constantly attacked. Yet Jesus never responded in kind—he always turned the other cheek; he never retaliated. Jesus calls us to leave everything behind—including our sinful ways—and follow him. Why delay?



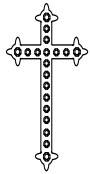

FAMILY PERSPECTIVE

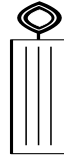
(from the Office of Family Life Education)

Parishioner Milestones

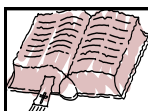

SAINTS CORNER

On January 31st we observe the commemoration of **St. John Bosco**. He was born at Castelnuovo d'Asti, Italy in 1815 and dedicated to education and was a pioneer in the field of professional schools. Because of his new educational methods, he encountered opposition from the traditional clergy as well as from politicians. By the time he died, at Turin in 1888, his work had spread throughout the world He was canonized in 1934, and in 1988, on the centennial of his death, he was declared a "Father and teacher of youth."
