

Thirty-second Sunday in Ordinary Time

Made To Rejoice



When we watch or read the news, it's hard to find good things happening. War rages and civilians suffer from starvation and disease. Wildfires destroy

homes and businesses. Floods and hurricanes sweep away livelihoods and treasured memories. Governments imprison dissenters and violently persecute missionaries.

Now look closer. Are you being bullied at work? Are you or a family member struggling to keep a marriage together? Are you watching a child, spouse or co-worker caught in the claws of addiction?

It's easy to rejoice and praise God when things are going well; it's much harder to rejoice in times of suffering.

The apostle Paul knew about suffering. He was imprisoned not once but twice, before ultimately being executed. Today's Bible verse comes from Paul's letter to the church at Philippi. When he wrote it, he was likely under house arrest, under constant surveillance and unable to move about freely. He was prisoner, yet he was encouraging his readers to rejoice!

Rejoice in the Lord always; again I will say rejoice.
Philippians 4:4

Your Savior, Jesus, also knew what it was to suffer. He suffered beatings and death on the cross, but he also grieved the death of his friend Lazarus. He watched with anger as money changers desecrated the temple. He saw the pain of the blind, the lame and the demon possessed. He ate with society's outcasts—prostitutes and tax collectors. Jesus walked in our broken world and knew our human pain, experiencing much of it himself.

But just as Paul rejoiced in suffering, we, too, as Jesus' followers, are made to rejoice in all circumstances. We can rejoice in the face of hardship because we are not alone—our Savior walks with us.

Because Jesus has promised us everlasting life, we can rejoice in our suffering we know it is only temporary.

Most of all, we know we are made to rejoice because rejoicing brings glory to God! When we rejoice in good times and in struggles, we acknowledge God's glory in our lives and in our world. He is in control and promises to work everything for the good of his creation (Romans 8:28). We are made to rejoice in God our Savior, always.

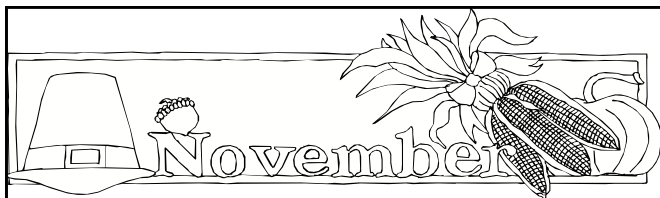

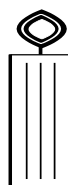

Holy Name Society Bereavement Mass

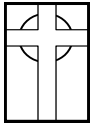
On Saturday, November 6th the Holy Name Society will have their Bereavement Mass for those members who have passed away. It will be in Church at the regular 4:00 pm Mass.

HOLY NAME 50/50 RAFFLE IS BACK!!

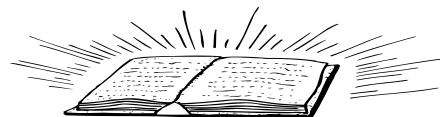
