Preparing Our Bodies

Reflection: A friend e-mailed me an ad for scapulars that claimed to be "the most comfortable scapulars ever made!"

"Since when were scapulars supposed to be comfortable?" he quipped, recalling the days when wearing a scapular was akin to donning a minihairshirt: itchy, uncomfortable, and purposefully so.

For better or for worse, the itchy days have passed. Today we expect comfort. Even fasting seems to have gone out of style. This is not necessarily a bad development; Catholics are not in the business of self-punishment or turning away from the good things in life. And surely we can all agree that a true fast consists in serving the poor and refraining from gossip, much more so than giving up sweets or lattes.

And yet our tradition bursts with examples of physical fasting. Saints and sinners alike have denied themselves good things for a time. Many a Bible hero has fasted during times of intense prayers. But why?

Fasting for a time is a way of preparing our bodies for something our eyes have not seen and our ears have not heard--something beyond even the good things of this world. We're not there yet; we're just on the cusp of it. The transfigured Christ in today's Gospel--face changed in prayer, clothes dazzling white, glorious in appearance--offers us a glimpse of what is to come.

St. Paul tells us that Jesus Christ will change our lowly bodies to conform with his glorified one. That's a moment well worth preparing for.

Meditation: At Jesus' transfiguration, the Father declares: "This is my chosen Son; listen to him." To listen to Jesus in prayer entails finding time and space for silence. Fasting from those activities and noises that so easily distract us can help us find that time and space. What a difference it makes when we are filled with the life-giving, transforming words of Jesus!


