What We Know About Joseph

Reflection: I'll never forget the first time I watched the holiday classic *It's a Wonderful Life.* A friend had urged me to watch it for years, but I never seemed to get around to it. The movie seemed old and dated. What message could it possibly hold for me?

Of course, the movie has a message for everyone. George Bailey thinks his life is a disaster. He feels held back by all of his obligations, his mistakes and his frustrations. But the, through the visit of an "aspiring angel," George sees what the world would have been like if he had never been born. He sees all the people he's known and how different and empty their lives would have been without him. George understands that his life has value--its value lies in the relationships he has forged, the good he had done, the people he has loved.

We can only hope to be as happy as George Bailey was in those moments of discovery-to see and understand that our lives matter because they touch other lives, to find joy in the ways our lives have intersected with others, to believe that those lives needed ours.

This is the way I think of St. Joseph, whose feast we celebrate on March 19th. We know so little about Joseph. But we do know that he as "the husband of Mary" and the father-guardian of Jesus. *We understand Joseph's life in relation to other lives*. And in that way, Joseph is the model human being, a true saint, Joseph wasn't righteous or good in and of himself. He was those things—and more—with others.

We have much to learn from Joseph. He is never depicted as speaking, but there is silent eloquence in the selfless care he provided for Mary and Jesus, in the precision of his work as a carpenter and in many other ways. He is also the model of someone who paid attention to his dreams and followed them.


TICKETS FOR BASKET BONANZA GO ON SALE THIS WEEKEND


