Easter Sunday of the Resurrection of the Lord

SHARE THE GLORY OF EASTER

Dear Parishioners,

"Resurrexit sicut dixit" - "He has risen as He said." These words were spoken by the angel to the faithful women at the empty tomb of Jesus on that first Easter morning. Actually, what the angel said was: "Do not be afraid! I know that you are seeking Jesus the crucified. He is not here, for He has risen as He said, Come and see the place where He lay." (Matthew 21: 5-6) Those remarkable words of hope spoken to the women nearly 2,000 years ago are spoken again to us today.

I'm sure many of us today share in what the faithful women were feeling when they went to the tomb of Jesus: fear, confusion, anxiety. The message of Easter is an Eternal message: suffering leads to glory, the cross leads to the empty tomb, death leads to life. The world around us continues to change. Yet one thing remains constant: God's love for us made manifest in the Resurrection of the Lord Jesus. In the Resurrection, Christ destroyed the worst of what the world has to offer us. The battle may still continue, but ultimately we know that the powers of sin, darkness, and death have been defeated. God is victorious!

Easter isn't going to bring an immediate end to all that afflicts us in the world today, but it should help us to face the challenges confronting us with a new sense of Hope. "Be not afraid" the angel said. Why? Because Christ has Risen! Inspired by that central mystery of Faith, we can confront any challenge this world places before us with a sense of peace in our hearts, with hope, and with the strength that is ours as the recipients of God's love.

There was more to the message of the angel to the women at the tomb. He also said, "Then go quickly and tell his disciples, 'He has been raised from the dead, and He is going before you to Galilee; there you will see Him."

The message of the Resurrection of Christ wasn't a personal gift offered to them; it was a message to be shared. So it must be with us. As we draw strength in the knowledge of the Resurrection, let us seek to share the glorious news with all those around us: the tomb is empty, He is not there, He has risen as He said!

You are all in my prayers; please remember to pray for me.

Origins of Easter Symbols: Lilies



The magnificent Easter Lily, with its sheer white petals, symbolizes life, purity, innocence, joy and peace. The beautiful white flowers of the lily were connected with these traits well before Jesus Christ. Many ancient allegories connect the flower with motherhood.

In early paintings, the Angel Gabriel is seen handing a bouquet of white lilies to the Virgin Mary. In other paintings, the saints are bringing vessels full of lilies to Mary and the baby Jesus. It is said that beautiful white lilies sprang up in the Garden of Gethsemane, where Jesus wept in the last hours before he was betrayed by Judas. The lilies sprang up where drops of Christ's sweat fell to the ground in his final hours of sorrow.

The lilies from Christ's time were not the Easter lily that we know today, which is native to the southern islands of Japan and now cultivated in areas such as California and Oregon. The lilies in Jesus' area were wild lilies of the valleys and fields. Still, our Easter lily serves as a reminder of the lilies mentioned frequently throughout the Bible. Easter lilies grace homes and churches each spring as a symbol of new life.
