

Divine Mercy Sunday



What is the meaning of Divine Mercy Sunday?

During the course of Jesus' revelations to St. Faustina on the Divine Mercy He asked on numerous occasions that a feast day be dedicated to the Divine Mercy and that this feast be celebrated on the Sunday after Easter. The liturgical texts of that day concern the institutions of the Sacrament of Penance, the Tribunal of the Divine Mercy and are thus already suited to the request of Our Lord. This Feast, which had already been granted to the nation of Poland and been celebrated within Vatican City, was granted to the Universal Church by Pope John Paul II on the occasion of the canonization of Sr. Faustina in 2000. In the decree the Congregation for Divine Worship and the Discipline of the Sacraments stated that "throughout the world the 2nd Sunday of Easter will receive the name Divine Mercy Sunday, a perennial invitation to the Christian world to face, with confidence in divine benevolence, the difficulties and trials that mankind will experience in the years to come."

When Should the Divine Mercy be prayed?

Just as the Image can serve as a reminder of the "ocean of Divine Mercy," as well as its price, so can the daily remembrance of the Divine Mercy at the hour of Christ's death. Jesus asked St. Faustina, and through her us, to celebrate the Hour of Great Mercy, promising tremendous graces for those who do so, both for themselves and for others.

At 3 o'clock, implore My mercy,
Especially for sinners; and, if only for
a brief moment, immerse yourself in
My Passion, particularly in
My abandonment at the moment of agony.
This is the hour of great mercy...
In this hour I will refuse nothing to
the soul that makes a request of
Me in virtue of My Passion.

Jesus' Mercy is incomparable. He wants—more than anything—for us to come to Him, to live with Him in Heaven. His Love, manifested on the Cross is the reason that the Chaplet is so powerful.

What is the Divine Mercy Chaplet?

Using the Marian Rosary, begin with the Sign of the Cross, then the group of 3 beads, the Our Father, the Hail Mary and the Apostles' Creed. On the beads of the 5 decades, say the following: on the Hail Mary beads—"For the sake of His sorrowful Passion, have mercy on us and on the whole world." Repeat for all decades. Conclude with (three times) "Holy God, Holy Mighty One, Holy Immortal One, have mercy on us and the whole world."

Why is St. Faustina important?

St. Faustina had unwavering faith in Jesus and was obedient to Him. Through her Diary, the world has come to better understand the Divine Mercy of Our Lord Jesus Christ.



Pope Francis on Divine Mercy Sunday: Beware of the Virus of 'Selfish Indifference'

Humanity could be struck by "an even worse virus" after the coronavirus crisis, that of "selfish indifference," Pope Francis said as he celebrated Mass on Divine Mercy Sunday, April 19th. He said we risk forgetting the poor as we eagerly await the end of the pandemic.

"Now, while we are looking forward to a slow and arduous recovery from the pandemic, there is a danger that we will forget those who are left behind. The risk is that we may then be struck by an even worse virus, that of selfish indifference. A virus spread by the thought that life is better if it is better for me, and that everything will be fine if it is fine for me."

"In life we go forward tentatively, uncertainly," he said, "like a toddler who takes a few steps and falls; a few steps more and falls again, yet each time his father puts him back on his feet. The hand that always puts us back on our feet is mercy: God knows that without mercy we will remain on the ground, that in order to keep walking, we need to be put back on our feet."

To those frustrated by falling time and time again, the pope said: "The Lord knows this and he is always ready to raise you up. He does not want us to keep thinking about our failings; rather he wants us to look to him. For when we fall, he sees children needing to be put back on their feet; in our failings he sees children in need of his love."


