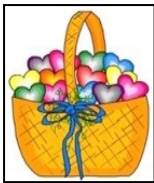

Each time slot will be 1 hour long and then we will leave ½ hour for cleaning in between.

4:45 (after 4:00 mass) to 6:00

We will draw the names of all winners at the end of the 4:45 time slot. (6:00) we will also be live streaming the drawing on the ourladyofpompei-stpeter facebook page!!

Your \$10.00 admission (**If you purchased your tickets last year they of course will be honored this year.**) Includes a delicious boxed hearty snack with croissant sandwich, chips, one of Father Dan's famous monster cookies, bottle of water and fruit. (You will have the option of eating it there at the event or bringing it home with you)!!! It also includes the usual 2 free raffle tickets and chances for door prizes during each time slot. Each additional chance is \$2.00 (with the usual cost breaks for multiple chances).

Instead of the silent auction this year, we will display the items we would have had for silent auction in the usual place with a higher raffle ticket price (\$10.00) for those *special chances*. And WOW are they ever great items!!!!

You can put together tables of family and friends that you are comfortable sitting with or we will seat you at a table with distancing in place. All tables will be separated (by at least 6') and we will rotate tables to get up and purchase and place your chances in the baskets. 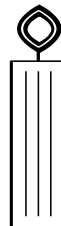

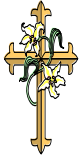

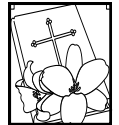

PACE CNY is particularly helpful to families desiring to keep their aging loved ones at home.
