Fourth Sunday of Easter



The Gospel tells us that we are to hear the voice of our shepherd Jesus and follow where he leads us. When we surrender our selfwills in this way we are promised that we will be lead into eternal

life. This is our Good News if we are willing to accept it. Accepting that from time to time we will not get to go in the direction we want, but will have Jesus' crook pull us in a direction not of our choosing.

This is how we can tell if we are in Jesus' sheepfold, when we feel the pulling and prodding of the shepherd's staff. Some may think that a good Christian life is when we experience no conflicts. It is quite the contrary. We are who we are; stubborn sheep who need guidance if we are to make it to the green pastures of eternal life. All of us—from the blessed saints down to the folks who struggle just to make it to Mass on Sundays—we are all in need of a little prodding now and then.

So let us ask ourselves where the Lord is leading us. Where do we feel the pulling and prodding? It is okay—we are not bad Christians if we need a good tug now and then in the right direction. It is only when we run from our shepherd's staff that we get into trouble. Thinking that we can make it by our wits, or that we are too good to need any further correction—that's the error to avoid here. We should always keep in mind that to be in the Lord's sheepfold we must accept being his sheep. And He will forever be our shepherd.

May is the Month of Mary May devotions to the Blessed Virgin Mary refer to special Marian devotions held in the Catholic Church during the month of May honoring Mary, Mother of God as "the Queen of May". These services may take place inside or outside. A "May Crowning" is a traditional Roman Catholic ritual that occurs in the month of May. The devotion has been supported by several popes including Pope Pius XII in his encyclical: *Ingruentium malorum* (English: *In the face of approaching evils*).

The custom of the family recitation of the Holy Rosary is a most efficacious means. What a sweet sight - most pleasing to God when, at eventide, the Christian home resounds with the frequent repetition of praises in honor of the High Queen of Heaven! Then the Rosary, recited in the family, assembled before the image of the Virgin, in an admirable union of hearts, the parents and their children, who come back from their daily work. It unites them piously with those absent and those dead. It links all more tightly in a sweet bond of love, with the most Holy Virgin, who, like a loving mother, in the circle of her children, will be there bestowing upon them an abundance of the gifts of concord and family peace.
