





CONGRATULATIONS

Congratulations to Rev. Daniel Caughey, Rev. Brendan Foley, Rev. John Leo Oduor and Rev. Dennis Walker on their recent ordination at the Cathedral of the Immaculate Conception. The Rite of Ordination takes place within the Rite of the Mass, beginning with the Entrance Procession.

The candidate is called from the midst of the people because the Church believes that those who are called to ministry answer the call from the Lord and are called from the midst of the Catholic community.

Next is the Presentation of the Candidate, as the bishop inquires if the candidate has taken all the preparatory steps and been found worthy and competent to fulfill the Order of the Priesthood. The bishop proceeds with his homily, including instructions to the candidate regarding what the Church will expect of him in his new role as a priest.

In the Examination of the Candidate, the bishop asks the candidate to speak of his willingness to be ordained. The candidate answers each question "I am," and to the last question, "I am with the help of God."

Next is the Promise of Obedience, which assures that both priest and bishop will work hand in hand to build the kingdom of God.

The bishop then calls the congregation to prayer. The essential rite of the sacrament—when the ordination takes place—is the laying on of hands and Prayer of Consecration (USCCB).

The ordained kneels before the bishop, who prays in silence, placing his hands on the head of the candidate and calling upon the Holy Spirit.

The newly ordained priest then removes his deacons' stole and is vested in the priests' stole. The bishop then anoints the priest's hands with Sacred Chrism, signifying the hands of the newly ordained priest are being prepared for the sacred duties.....ministry.

The Rite of Ordination concludes with the Sign of Peace. Having been given the gifts to exercise his office, the new priest is welcomed into the Order of the Priesthood first by the bishop and then by his brother priests. The Liturgy of the Eucharist is celebrated by the bishop, with the newly ordained taking a role in his first celebration of the Eucharist as a priest.
